

S-2 Command Chronology

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS. On 6 March 1966, the CHIEU HOI Center in DANANG, informed us they had 5 ralliers in their possession who had information on 2 additional ralliers in the 3^d Battalion ZOA who wanted to rally. After interrogation, the 5 ralliers accompanied by a Marine patrol to the designated location and met the 2 ralliers. In addition, the 2 ralliers surrendered 5 M-79 rounds, 1 M-26 grenade, 1 steel helmet, 1 flashlight (US), and 1 cartridge belt (see 151215H, entry INTSUM # 4).
2. NEW DEVELOPMENTS. None.
3. PROBLEM AREAS. At the present time there are 5 interpreters assigned to this battalion, 1 of whom was wounded and is presently in an ARVN hospital. The shortage of interpreters has made collection of information from indigenous personnel, the proper functioning of the civil affairs program, and liaison with local Vietnamese forces, difficult. It is felt that 9 interpreters is the minimum required by an infantry battalion, with the ideal being sufficient interpreters to allow assignment of one per infantry platoon, with 3 additional at the Battalion C.P. for use by the Command Group and S-2 during field operations, the Battalion Aid Station, Chaplain, and Civil Affairs Officer in the Battalion People to People program.
4. WEATHER. Weather in the Battalion ZOA was moderate to clear during the reporting period, and did not appreciably influence any of the activities of this battalion. A total of .4 inches of rain was recorded during the month of March, which is a decrease of 2.0 inches from February.
5. INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY.
 - a. VC activity during the month of March decreased over the month of February. Activity in the Battalion ZOA consisted mainly of mine and surprise firing device incidents, and isolated small arms incidents by individuals or small groups ranging in number from 1-10.
 - b. The major exception was on the night of 24/25 March when "E" Company 2/9 (Opcon 3/3) encountered an estimated 2 VC mainforce companies of the R-20 Battalion. The action resulted in 43 VC KIA by body count (see 250030H, entry INTSUM # 61, 251600H, entry INTSUM # 71, Additional Information entry INTSUM # 72, and 261700H, entry INTSUM # 73).
 - c. There were 98 VC initiated incidents in the Battalion ZOA during March, as compared with 155 during February. These incidents consisted of :
 - (1) 56 Incidents of small arms compared to 69 in February.
 - (2) 37 mine/surprise firing device incidents compared to 69 in February. This figure includes those detonated as well as those discovered and destroyed.

(3) 5 close-in infiltration attempts compared to 6 in February. These consisted of VC who infiltrated to within hand grenade range, or who were detected attempting to get through defensive positions.

6. TARGET INFORMATION. None.

The Marines pursued the fleeing enemy, but a search of the area revealed no VC bodies. The Marine patrol then received 5 rounds S/A fire from a cane field at (LT 953633). The Marines directed 13 155mm artillery rounds, 20 60mm rounds, and 4 3.5 inch WP rounds at the enemy position, and the fire ceased. The Marines could not pursue the enemy position since the fire came from the Eastern side of the SONG YEN river. No USMC casualties were reported. One VC KIA (body count), 1 VC probable KIA, and 4 VC probable WIA were reported.

(8) At 09205H, a Company M patrol moving to an ambush position in the vicinity of (LT 975673) reported receiving approximately 350 rounds auto and semi-automatic S/A fire and an estimated 10 rifle grenades or M-79 rounds from 10 to 15 VC positioned 200 meters Northwest, 75 meter East, and 75 meters south of the Marines position. The Marines directed 500 rounds S/A fire, 20 M-79 rounds and 19 61mm mortar rounds, resulting in 2 VC (probably) WIA who were seen hit by the Marines fire. A second squad was dispatched from the Co M C.P. to aid in pursuing the fleeing VC. The VC broke contact after initial fire, and believed to have withdrawn to the North and Northwest. Thirty rounds of 105mm artillery were fired at (LT 970680) and (LT 971685). Helo coming in for med-evac received undetermined amount of S/A fire from (LT 978678). The second squad was unable to gain contact and joined the first squad as med-evac was completed. Area was searched and units moved into ambush positions for remainder of night. Detailed search of area will be conducted at first light on 10 March. 1 KIA and 2 WIA USMC were reported.

(9) At 092200H, a Company M SID positioned at (LT 972652) detected movement to the front of the Marines position in the vicinity of (LT 968666). The Marines directed 12 81mm mortar rounds and 2 3.5 inch W.P. rounds at the suspected enemy position, with unknown results. Another SID detected movement in the vicinity of (LT 967661), and 2 VC were seen running away from the Marines position. The Marines directed 75 rounds S/A fire, and observed both VC fall as if struck by the fire. The report indicated the Marines directed an additional 20 61mm mortar rounds at possible VC positions at (LT 967672). Patrols were dispatched were unable to gain contact with the VC, and unable to recover any VC casualties. Two VC probable WIA were reported. No USMC casualties were reported.



(5) At 101130h, a Company "M" patrol reported destroying 2 covered punji traps 1'x1'x2' deep in the vicinity of (LF 969605). The report indicated 1 punji trap had a CHICOM grenade attached to the cover which was rigged to detonate with a trip wire.

(6) At 101130h, a Company "M" patrol reported destroying 1 M-26 grenade at (LF 962679), which was rigged to detonate with a trip wire.

(7) At 101130h, a Company "M" patrol reported destroying 1 M-26 grenade at (LF 956602) that was rigged to detonate with a trip wire.

(8) At 101420h, the Company "I" river block positioned at (LF 973611) reported receiving 3 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned in the vicinity of (LF 975609). The Marines directed 50 rounds S/A fire, 4 M-79 rounds, and 20 90mm tank rounds, at the enemy position, and observed a direct hit (90 mm round) on 1 VC seen running from a building. A patrol was dispatched to pursue the VC, and a search of the area revealed 1 VC KIA (body count). The report stated 1 M-1 rifle, 1 M-26 grenade, 1 pistol belt, 1 flashlight (US), 2 carbine magazines, 3 clips M-1 ammunition, and 1 ammunition pouch was recovered from the dead VC. One USMC KIA was reported.

(9) At 101520h, a Company "L" patrol operating in the vicinity of (LF 951651) reported observing 3 VC who began fleeing when challenged by the Marines. The Marines directed 50 rounds S/A fire at the enemy, and observed 1 VC fall as if struck by the fire. The patrol pursued until contact was lost in a tree line. A search of the area revealed a trail of blood indicating 1 VC probable KIA.

(10) At 101520h, a Company "L" patrol reported discovering a small amount of medical supplies, 1 green uniform, 1 pair khaki trousers, 1 61mm mortar container (empty), and 1 unidentified ammunition can in a building at (LF 951651) which will be evacuated to the Battalion S-2 for evaluation.

(11) At 101545h, a Company "I" security element positioned at (LF 966617), reported observing (through a SC scope) 2 VC (1 armed with a rifle), in the vicinity of (LF 976604). The Marines directed 9 90mm tank rounds, and 10 61mm mortar rounds at the enemy position, scoring direct hits on the VC. The Marines could not recover the bodies or search the area because of the Song Hinh River. Two VC probable KIA were reported.

(12) At 102245h, the Company "I" river block positioned at (LF 973611) observed a 12' boat approaching the river block from the SW. The Marines reported 250 rounds S/A fire, and 9 M-79 rounds sinking the boat. It could not be determined if anyone was in the boat.

(13) At 102010h, a Company "M" security element positioned at (L 960651) reported receiving 1 grenade from VC positioned at 310. The Marines directed 15 rounds S/A fire, and 1 M-79 rounds at the suspected enemy position with unknown results. A search of the area revealed a signs of VC casualties. No USMC casualties were reported.

c. Information Received from Villagers.

At 101020h, the villagers of LA CANU (3) informed the Marines of Company "L", that 10 VC were in the hamlet on the night of 9 March. The villagers stated the VC took a lot of rice, and killed 1 young boy.

There is evidence that VC have been modifying conventional shaped charges to utilize their blast effect horizontally as directional mines. Several such mines have been uncovered and destroyed in the third Marines T.O.R.

All units upon capture or uncovering of shaped charges, or other suspected directional mines, report same immediately to this headquarters and to engineer/EDD unit most available. All such mines recovered will be destroyed only in connection with meeting test requirements by competent personnel.

If recovering such charges or directional mines is impractical, commanders should destroy them on spot for safety of troops. However, all suspected directional mines so destroyed will be specifically described in spot reports and unit reports and unit INFOSUMs.

b. Enemy Activity.

(1) At 141010H, a Company "I" security patrol accompanying an engineer unit observed 1 male apparently placing a mine in road vicinity (LT 985633). When patrol was sighted by individual, he fled west into THUD CLM #3 (LT 974626). The patrol pursued and noted comm. wire leading from road toward village. As patrol approached the village it was fired on by an estimated 4 to 5 Viet Cong vicinity (LT 968626) with 2 automatic weapons and 2 rifles. The squad returned fire and assaulted into village. A second squad was dispatched from (LT 970620) and as it approached the western end of village, was taken under fire by an estimated 5 VC in vicinity of (LT 970629). A running fire fight ensued with one squad approaching from the west and one from the east toward the center of the village. The VC fired an estimated 400 rds of S/A and patrol elements expended approx. 500 rds M-14 and 300 rds M-60 ammo. During the search of the village, 10 males were apprehended in houses and 1 was found hiding in a spider hole. All 11 were evacuated to IIT. The comm wire previously noted was traced and a 15 lb shape charge was found and turned over to engineers.

(2) At 141400H, Company "L" received a report from HIEU DUC District Headquarters that a squad of VC had organized the villagers of BO BIN (1) (AT 960686) and were gathering rice. The District chief requested that all persons in the above area be apprehended and delivered to District Headquarters if forces were available. Two platoons were dispatched from Hill #22 and "Sparrow Hawk" was requested and dispatched to the area. A total of 63 suspicious persons were apprehended and delivered to HIEU DUC District Headquarters. Villagers were lectured by District chief and questioning of individuals furnished information on a VC located in the vicinity. A PF unit will conduct a sweep of this area on 15 March.

(3) At 141430H, a Company "M" patrol discovered 2 tunnels 3'X3'X6' deep vicinity of (AT 977677) and (AT 973678). Both were checked visually and then destroyed with 5 lbs of demolition each.

(4) At 141630H, Company "I" squad at (AT 963609) observed 2 males digging a hole vicinity (AT 968605). One male got into the hole and the other camouflaged the top. Fired 4 90MM tank rds and observed a direct hit. 1 VC KIA (probable) was reported.

(5) At 142010H, Company "L" C.P. located vicinity (AT 953667) received 8 rds of S/L fire from the N.E. of their position. They were unable to determine exact source of fire. No casualties were reported.

(6) At 142300H, a Company "M" platoon position vicinity (AT 962659) reported 2 grenades detonated outside the platoon perimeter. Marines returned 11 grenades on the suspected VC position, illuminated and searched the area but were unable to make contact with the VC. No casualties were reported.

(1) At 151115H, a Company "I" patrol reported receiving 2 Viet Cong ralliers in the vicinity of (AT 987629). The ralliers surrendered 5 M-79 rounds, 1 M-26 grenade, 1 steel helmet, 1 flashlight (US), and 1 cartridge belt with pouch, which will be evacuated to the Regimental S-2 for evaluation.

(2) At 151215H, a Company "I" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 962639), reported receiving 50 rounds S/A fire from VC positioned in cane fields at (AT 961634), (AT 967643) and (AT 965644). The Marines directed 125 rounds S/A fire, and 13 81MM mortar rounds at the enemy positions and the enemy fire ceased. A search of the area failed to reveal any sign of enemy casualties. No casualties were reported.

(3) At 151500H, a Company "I" patrol reported apprehending 5 female VC at (AT 967638). The report indicated the 5 CHIEU HOI ralliers with the patrol pointed out the females as being VC. The ralliers stated they had operated in the area last year, and remember the females as being active Viet Cong. The ~~convicts~~ were evacuated to IIT for interrogation.

(1) At 161612H, a Company "L" patrol reported destroying a punji trap at (LT 954653). The report indicated the trap was rigged with a CHICOM grenade positioned to detonate with a trip wire.

(2) At 161750H, a grader (earth-mover) detonated an unidentified type mine at (LT 981628). The report indicated the explosion caused no damage to the machine except for blowing 1 of the tires. No casualties were reported.

(5) at 170015H, ARVN outpost located vicinity (AT 948584) was reported under attack. Company "I" directed 256 81MM mortar rounds in support of 1st Co, 1st Bn, 51st ARVN Regt. No additional information available.

(6), At 170155H, Company "I" river block located vicinity (AT 973621) observed a small boat moving south to north on river. The Marines directed 60 rounds S/A fire sinking the boat. It was not determined if any one was in the boat. No casualties were reported.

At (AT 975615) an additional VC body was found armed with grenades. Three USMC KIA and 2 USMC WIA were reported. Two VC KIA were reported. Additional information will be provided when available.



(1) At 170615H, Company "L" elements taking part in "County Fair", reported apprehending 4 VCS in the vicinity of (AT 967696) which were evacuated to the ARVN C.P. located in CLM NE (4) for interrogation.

(2) At 171130H, Company "I" provided additional information on the VC attack on the river block (see 170410H, entry INTSUM # 62). The report stated that when the Marines directed 1 claymore mine at the VC, screams were heard, and a search of the area revealed drag marks indicating 1 VC probable KIA. 

The patrol pursued, and a search of the area revealed 1 VC KIA (body count), and 1 CHICOM grenade. One VC probable WIA was also reported.

(8) At 221450H, a Company "M" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 956639), reported observing 5 VC moving across a rice paddy at (AT 954634) carrying what was believed to be a wounded VC. The Marines directed 150 rounds S/A fire at the enemy position, and observed 3 VC fall as is struck by the Marines fire. The Marines physically pursued, and a search of the area revealed blood trails and drag marks. Three VC probable WIA were reported.

(9) At 221720H, a Company "L" patrol operating in the vicinity of (AT 950633) reported observing 3 VC positioned at (AT 952635). Two warning shots were ignored as the VC attempted to swim east across the SONG YEN. The Marines directed 150 rounds S/A fire killing 2 VC (body count), and wounding 1 VC, who made it to shore and managed to crawl into thick brush. No equipment was recovered.







2. MISSION.

3. EXECUTION.

One UH-1E transmits surrender message over objective area during approach of friendly forces. Company I provides one platoon (rein) to provide security for five ralliers, and to conduct search and destroy mission in area of operations. Company I provides one blocking force on southern sector of objective area during the approach ~~force~~ of friendly units, and prepares to accommodate any VC ralliers in Company I CP until conclusion of operation. Company L establishes one platoon (rein) patrol base vicinity LT 9463 and controls western bank of BINH YEN River from LT 955640 to LT 955630. Company M provides one platoon (rein) to converge from the north on objective area in coordination with Company I, to report under the operational control of Company I force upon link-up. On order, Company I blocking force to south of objective area is released to return to Company I CP. Company I and Company M platoons seek out possible VC ralliers, and search out and destroy enemy fortifications within objective area during a period of about 2 days.

b. Company I (Rein)

- (1) Prepare to receive 5 "CHIEU HOI" ralliers, and D.NANG "CHIEU HOI" program Chief, on hill 55 at about 0700H of D-Day. Make final coordination with ralliers, and be prepared to execute minor changes to this operation plan based upon any new information provided by ralliers at that time.
- (2) Provide one platoon (rein) to provide security for ralliers (who will accompany platoon), and have platoon prepared to proceed to and receive 3 ralliers vicinity church at LT 986629. 1. On 6 March, a Mr. Kelley, American representative to the I Corps CHIEU HOI program, informed Swain-2 through Senator-2 that 5 Viet Cong who had rallied from our ZUA (vicinity AT 9863) were in his possession, and offered information which he felt would be of use to this battalion.
2. Upon interrogation by Swain-2, it was learned that there are 3 additional Viet Cong in the hamlet of BICH BAC (AT 987630) who wish to rally. Communication is being maintained with the Viet Cong, and arrangements are being made, in conjunction with Operation Plan 4-66, to meet the Viet Cong in the hamlet of BICH BAC, and return them to GVN control.
3. The ralliers indicated they will lead the Marines to a tree line in the hamlet of BICH BAC in which Viet Cong hide from Marine patrols, and in which Viet Cong rest when Marines aren't in the area. They indicated only 4 Viet Cong (not including the 3 who want to rally) are operating in BICH BAC, with the primary mission of making, and positioning mines and surprise firing devices in that area. They continued to say that most of the Viet Cong left the BICH BAC hamlet area when the Marines moved to Hill #55, and the HA LONG bridge.
4. Four of the ralliers told of a large tunnel complex located in the vicinity of LE SON (5), (AT 955637). One rallier stated he spent 2 days in the tunnel as a laborer. The tunnel was described as being 400 meters in length, having 3 entrances, and located approximately 100 meters from the SONG YEN. The 4 continued that some 25 Viet Cong are operating in the area, each having a personal weapon.

5. On 15 March, the 5 ralliers, Swain-2, Vietnamese Liaison Officer and 2 scouts will accompany the Company "I" patrol to search out the above mentioned areas. The ralliers accompanying the patrol will be dressed in green utilities and helmet liners to disguise their identity. Mr. Kelley, the Chief of the CHISU HOI program (D. NANG area) and 1 interpreter from the CHISU HOI center will remain on Hill #55.

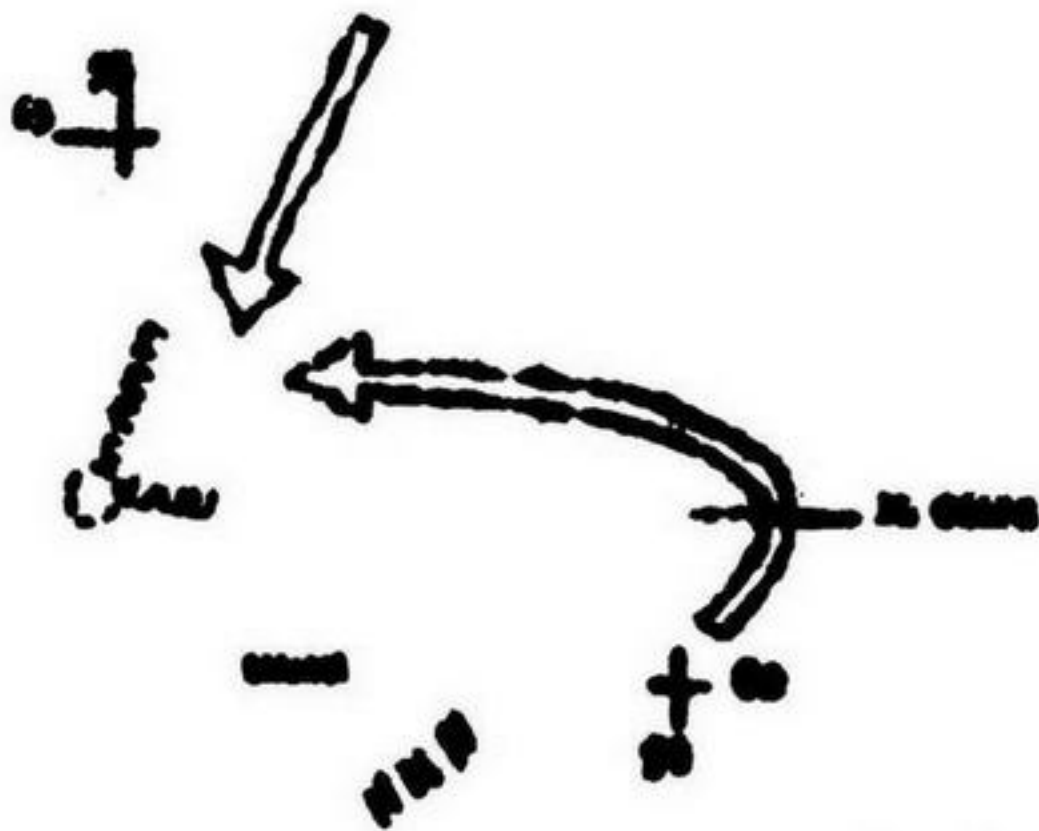

1. ITEM: Securing VCS while they are moving with a patrol.

DISCUSSION: Often patrols are considerable distance from their patrol base or platoon CP when they capture VCS. In order to secure the VCS and maintain security over him during the remainder of the patrol, experience has proved a rifle sling to be an efficient means of securing the suspect's hands. One end of the sling is used to bind the prisoner's hands behind his back and the other end is held by one member of the patrol. The rifle sling is preferable to line, which cuts off circulation.

RECOMMENDATION: That troops be made aware of this field expedient for securing and handling prisoners.

2. ITEM: Illumination for searching family bomb shelters.

DISCUSSION: Each family has candle or lantern in their hut.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Have a member of the family light one of their own candles and lead Marines into the family shelter when it is to be searched.

3. ITEM: Use of scout dogs on patrols.

DISCUSSION: Normally there are too many distractions in a populated area for effective use of dogs on day patrols. Villagers, and especially villagers' dogs, chickens, pigs and water buffaloes distract the dog to a high degree, thereby reducing its effectiveness.

RECOMMENDATION: That scout dogs not be utilized on patrols in populated areas.

3. ITEM: Tactical use of Cs/CN gas.

DISCUSSION: Large cane fields make excellent hiding places for VC and provide good cover from many weapons. They are difficult and dangerous to search. CS/CN gas grenades used as rifle grenades allow quick and effective checks of cane field.

RECOMMENDATION: More Cs/CN should be employed as rifle grenades to check cane fields. Wind direction must be considered when employing Cs/CN in this manner.

7. ITEM: Search and destroy operation of enemy areas.

DISCUSSIONS: When on search and destroy operations the area assigned is often too wide for an effective search, allowing VC to escape by hiding between units involved.

RECOMMENDATION: That limited areas be assigned for search and destroy operations allowing a thorough search of the entire assigned area.

8. ITEM: Donation of 12 M-79 grenade launchers to TL of H&S Co

DISCUSSION: While in Vietnam, H&S Co has frequently been called upon to commit a tactical platoon. With the proven success of M-79 grenade launcher in Vietnam it would be of great benefit for H&S to have these weapons as authorized TL weapons for employment. In addition to M-79's being employed by the H&S tactical platoon when it is operationally committed, the M-79 grenade launcher could be employed on the defensive perimeter of the battalion C.A.

RECOMMENDATION: That 12 M-79's be issued to the TL of H&S Co.

9. ITEM: Sparrow Hawk

DISCUSSION: When Sparrow Hawk is committed it is difficult for the company commander to initially control the inserted units on the ground by radio because of frequent communications difficulty with the new ground unit, and because of uncertainty of the unit's exact initial location. The Sparrow Hawk net generally becomes congested with traffic trying to keep the company commander informed so he can effectively control the operation. It would be to the company commander's advantage, and facilitate better control, if the UH 1E's escorting the M-34's would pick up the company commander at a pre-designated LZ given in the Sparrow Hawk request. The company commander would then be able to observe the ground units and effectively control them without tying up the net with frequent initial position reports.

RECOMMENDATION: That UH 1E's land at LZ designated in Sparrow Hawk request and pick up company commander prior to landing Sparrow Hawk ground units.

10. ITEM: Pre-Planned Fire Support.

DISCUSSION: It is not unusual for a patrol to be fired upon from three sides. The unit leader must make maximum use of his fire support to neutralize some of the fire while engaging the other. This fire support is needed within minutes to be effective due to nature of the VC hit and run tactics.

RECOMMENDATION: That pre-planned concentrations be used at all times and when possible the guns laid on same.

11. ITEM: Flashlights

DISCUSSION: Patrols are required to search out caves, tunnels, bunkers and other areas where visibility is limited. A small, waterproof flash light is needed in each fire team. The present Marine Corps flash light is not available in sufficient numbers and does not hold up under our present operating conditions.

RECOMMENDATION: That a waterproof durable flashlight be made available and issued down to the fire team level.

12. ITEM: Squad Radios.

DISCUSSION: The tempo of our operations (patrols, LP's, etc), and the close, dense areas in which we operate calls for good, rapid communications. Control is a must if we are to properly exploit the brief, sudden contacts with the VC.

RECOMMENDATION: That small, transistorized radios be made available at the squad level.

13. ITEM: Marking Rounds

DISCUSSION: There are many instances that call for the marking of targets for aircraft, other units, and at times other members of the same unit. Rice paddy and sugar cane areas frequently do not contain readily identifiable reference points (especially for aircraft).

RECOMMENDATION: That w.r. rounds be provided for the M-72 and the 106, and that a type of marking round for the M-79, possibly phosphorous, be developed for marking as well as killing purposes.

14. ITEM: Population Control

DISCUSSION: Identification of indigenous personnel is a continuing problem. ID cards in VC-controlled areas are outdated for the most part, and worthless even if official. (Many VC have proper, official identification.) Intimidation of those that are not pro-VC is a fact of life.

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RECOMMENDATION: That coordination be effected so that local village w. (hamlet chief when possible) of known loyalties be used to identify all persons for Marine units, before evacuation as VCS. (Interpreters and PLT's cannot always make proper determination)
