S-2 CHRONOLOGY

1. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS. During June the Battalion displaced from the Da Nang Air Base (BI 004746) to its present location (MI 952726). The Battalion made the displacement during the period 13 - 16 June and assumed O&C of its present ZOA on 160800h, Jun 1966. The enemy activity consisted mainly of booby trap/mine incidents with the most significant activity being a PF unit's encounter with an estimated VC platoon on 182315h, in the vicinity of (MI 952701). This was the largest VC force encountered in the Battalion's ZOA during the period. Most encounters were with groups of 5 or less.

2. Non-Developments. The first known incidents of sabotage/terrorism in our ZOA occurred on 280315h, when a charge of unknown size was detonated in a building, in which the future Village headquarters would have been located. A shaped charge (approx 20 lbs) had been rigged to the front of the building, but was not detonated. On 292325h, a flammable liquid (possibly AVGAS or JP-4) was poured on the bridge located at (AT 943-677) and set afire rendering the bridge unserviceable.

3. PROBLEM AREAS.

a. Interpreters. The shortage of interpreters, an ever continuing problem, is more acutely felt in our present ZOA (semi-cleared area) than in previous operations in uncleared areas. There is closer and much more frequent contact with local indigenous personnel in conjunction with the civic action/civil affairs programs. With the two (2) GAC platoons now operating and a third being formed, it is felt that one interpreter should be assigned to each of these platoons for effective liaison between the Marine and PF personnel assigned to these units. It is felt that minimum number of interpreters required by an infantry battalion is nine (9). The ideal would be sufficient numbers to allow assignment of one interpreter to each platoon and Company Commander (4 per Co) and 5 to the Battalion CP. Additional allowances must be made for Battalions having Vietnamese units operating within their ZOA, or who have mixed Vietnamese/Marines (such as the GAC platoons) units attached.

b. AM/TPS-21. The increase in allowance of one additional generator per set has partially solved this cause of set down time. The short life of some electrical components due to high temperatures and humidity is still a problem and replacement of the AM/TPS-21 is recommended as improved units become available.

4. Weather. During June there has been an increase in rain fall over the preceding month and increased periods of cloudiness with early morning haze and fog in the mountain valley areas. The maximum high temperature recorded during the month was 99° and the low recorded was 74°. There was a total of 4.8 inches of rain recorded.

5. INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY.

a. VC activity during June in the Battalion's ZOA was at a very low level, both at the Da Nang Air Base from the first through the fifteenth, and in our new ZOA from the sixteenth through the end of the reporting period. The primary VC activity during the month were nine incidents.

b. During the first half of the month while the Battalion was at the Da Nang Air Base, there were three VC initiated incidents. Two of these involved grenades being thrown at perimeter security elements and one was small arms fire.

c. During the second half of the month there were a total of 20 VC initiated incidents. No meaningful comparison can be made with previous periods as the Battalion moved into a new area on 16 June after having been assigned as Air Base Defense Battalion for the previous month and a half. The VC initiated incidents consisted of the following:

- (1) 14 mine incidents
- (2) 4 small arms incidents. Three of these incidents were with individuals or small groups. One incident was between a PF unit and an estimated VC platoon.
- (3) 2 incidents of sabotage/terrorism

7. SPECIAL INTELLIGENCE REPORTS. none

8. PRISONER REPORT.

a. There was 1 VCC apprehended during the month.

b. There were 5 VCS apprehended and evacuated to IFA or turned over to the Hieu Duc District headquarters.

9. DEATH CASUALTIES.

a. There were 2 VC killed by body count during June.

b. There were 2 VC wounded (probable) during June.

10. CAPTURED WEAPONS AND SUPPLIES. Captured weapons and equipment included 2 M-26 grenades, 2 C-4000 grenades, 1 20 lb shape charge, and 1 directional mine. There were 3 105mm and 1 81mm rounds found and destroyed. Three of the rounds were mined and evidently intended for future use as booby traps or mines.

11. DESTROYED WEAPONS/SUPPLIES. There were 4 tunnels and 5 punji pits destroyed during the period.

* No daily intelligence summaries were issued from the 1st through the 16th of June while the Battalion was at the Da Nang Air Base.

1. 300815H - Co I patrol observed 4 VC vic AT902705. Patrol fired at VC which resulted in 1 VC KIA. Patrol pursued other VC one of which appeared to be wounded. VC were carrying carbines and wore black clothing. Patrol captured 1 M-26 grenade, medical supplies, small batteries, clean clothing, note book, raps and money which appeared to be of North Vietnamese origin. Area searched with negative results.
2. 301100H - CAC patrol vic AT924722 apprehended 3 VCS. One was loitering near CAC asking many questions. One claimed to be 12 yrs old but looked 18 yrs old and had no ID card, the other had no ID card. Sent to Hieu Duc Dist Hq.
3. 301340H - Co M patrol discovered 2 CHICOM grenades rigged as mines vic AT953682. Trip wires were attached to each grenade and were stretched across trail. Mines were destroyed and area searched with negative results.
4. 301755H - Co M patrol vic AT956685 discovered and destroyed 2 CHICOM grenades rigged as mines in 2 punji traps. Mines had a pressure-release type firing device. Area searched with negative results. Patrol continued mission.

1. 288030H - OAC ambush via AF950692 fired on 2 VC carrying 1 Thompson SMG and 1 US Carbine. Ambush observed 1 VC fall when struck by fire (1 MIA prob). Area search produced negative results. Will conduct another search at first light.

1. 270230H - Co I patrol in ambush position vic AT963697 killed 1 VC. VC appeared to be approximately 15 years old. No weapons or papers were found on the body.
2. 271015H - Co I laundry boy reported a mine located AT919709. Fire team with Engrs dispatched to investigate. Prior to arrival patrol heard explosion. At location of reported mine the patrol found a dead VN female. Engrs believed mine contained 1 lb explosive and was non-electrical. Area searched w/neg results.
3. 271115H - Co I patrol detonated an M-26 grenade booby trap. Patrol observed 1 VC vic AT889666 out of SA range. VC appeared to be observing USMC. Patrol pursued and VC fled. 6 other VC were observed in the same area that booby trap was detonated. Patrol fired and the 6 VC fled. VC were pursued and the area searched with negative results.
4. 271445H - Co I apprehended 52 year old VN male vic AT895686. Interpreters believed that VN had vital information. VN reported OP at which Co I observed 3 VC vic AT887678. Arty fired 4 rds. VN was evacuated by helo to Hieu Duc District Hq for interrogation. Interrogation produced following information:
 - a. Unknown number of VC commanded by LE-UT are located at AT964675 (S-2 rates F/4).
 - b. VC Co located at AT916673 (S-2 rates F/4).
 - c. VC observe USMC patrols from high ground (West of TAOR) and place booby traps in their routes (S-2 rates F/2).

Enemy Activities 3d Battalion, 3d Marines.

1. 261000H - Co K apprehended 1 VCS, age 14, vic AT9669. Interpreter states VCS is source of VC intelligence. Suspect was transferred to Hieu Duc Dist Hq for interrogation.
2. 261830H - Co K patrol vic AT898711 discovered 3 tunnels. Tunnels were 20 meters apart. Each tunnel was "L" shaped, about 12 ft deep and running 6 ft by about 3 ft high by 2 ft wide. Food scraps were found indicating habitation within the last 24-48 hrs. Two of the tunnels were searched with negative results. 1 Grenade was thrown before entering last tunnel and a secondary explosion occurred. Tunnel was searched with negative results. All tunnels were destroyed.

1. 251025H - CAC-1 patrol, at AT931688, discovered 2 mines, one of which was electrically detonated by the enemy, killing 1 PF and wounding 1 VN female. Patrol then received small arms fire immediately upon detonation of mine. CAC-1 returned fire and searched area with negative results. VC are believed to be hiding in a cave. Captured mine was armed with blasting cap. Patrol also discovered 1 M-26 grenade with fuze removed and with a round in bottom sitting on top of a nail. One 20mm round filled with buck shot and sealed with wax was also discovered. Uncovered 5 punji traps, at AT953688. Mine and grenade were turned over to EOD team. EOD team expressed great interest in these items. This is the first time that EOD team has seen this type of claymore mine and a grenade rigged in this manner. A search and destroy operation is planned in this area on 26 Jun 1966.
2. 251230H - Co I patrol, at AT918694, discovered one 105mm dud. Dud was destroyed by engineers.

1. 240840H - Co D patrol, at AT886713, discovered a house which appeared to have been recently occupied. Next to the house was a ladder against a tree. A signal drum was located at the top of the tree. The house and ladder were destroyed. Secondary explosions occurred in the house. Area was searched with negative results.
2. 242210H - Co K patrol in ambush position, at AT882713, opened fire on 1 VC who was observed approximately 300 meters from their position. The area was illuminated and searched with negative results.

2. 231015H - Co I patrol, at AT909699, discovered and destroyed 1 tunnel with 3'x4' entrance to a 6'x10' room and another 6'x8' tunnel leading further into the hill. Searched area with negative results.
3. 231000H - Co K patrol with RF, at AT873708, detonated a CHICOM grenade booby trap. Grenade was positioned 4-5' off the ground and was connected to a trip wire across the trail. Patrol searched area with negative results.
4. 231320H - Co K patrol member, at AT881706, detonated a booby trap. Trip wire was fastened to CHICOM grenade which was tied to a tree. Area was searched with negative results.

1. 211150H - Co K patrol, vicinity AF872714, detonated an M-26 type booby trap. Area searched with negative results. Patrol continued mission.

1. 191005H - CAC patrol apprehended 1 VC female age 18 vicinity AF955682. VC was taken to Hieu Duc District Hq where she confessed to being a VC while being interrogated. (This was erroneously reported under enemy activity, 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, Datsun #170).
2. 200650H - Co I patrol vicinity AF905686 detonated explosive device believed to have been an M-26 grenade in C-ration can. Area searched with negative results. Patrol continued mission.
3. 201730H - CAC platoon opened fire on 3 armed VU vicinity Bo Ban (2) (AF961691). 2 of the VC escaped in a tree line and 1 VU was killed by small arms fire. His body fell into the river and was not recovered. A search of the area was conducted and terminated at 201045H without further contact. A VCS was taken under fire and wounded by CAC small arms fire vicinity AF970696. VCS was treated at 3/3 Bn aid station and sent to Hieu Duc for questioning. See Encl (4), para 3.
4. 201950H - Co I located at pontoon bridge (AF946699) was approached by a VN male named NGUYEN PHUOC, ID card No. 030884. He claimed to be a secret agent and wanted permission to cross the bridge and wander around at will. Co I CP called Hieu Duc Dist. Hq for verification. Hieu Duc Dist Hq did not recognize his name. Man was placed under guard as a VCS and will be sent to Hieu Duc Dist Hq in the morning for interrogation.
5. 202155H - Co I heard movement west of platoon position located AF927683. Area was illuminated and 3 VU were observed running about 35 meters outside of wire. VC were taken under small arms and M-79 fire. Area searched with negative results. At 202215H 2 VC were observed vicinity AF929680 moving west approximately 30 to 50 meters from wire. Marines opened fire with small arms and M-79 rounds. One VC staggered and fell as if hit by this fire. Unit is positive of wounding 1 VC but a search conducted by fire team could not locate the body. Another search will be conducted at first light.

Marines fired 5 M-14 rounds at the VCS. The village in the vicinity was searched with negative results. Patrol leader stated that villagers appeared frightened and acted as if VC had been in the area.

THE CO I SECURITY ELEMENT LOCATED AT THE PONTOON BRIDGE (AT 946-697) AT 201950H OBSERVED AND APPREHENDED A MALE VCS. THE VCS' NAME WAS NGUYEN PHUOC, HE HAD AN ID CARD IN HIS POSSESSION, NO 030884. HE STATED THAT HE WAS A SECRET AGENT AND WANTED PERMISSION TO CROSS THE BRIDGE AND WANDER IN THE AREA AT WILL. THE CO I SECURITY ADVISED THE CO I CP OF THE MATTER. HIEU DUC DISTRICT HEADQUARTERS WAS INFORMED BUT WERE UNFAMILIAR WITH THE VCS' NAME. THE VCS WAS TAKEN TO CO I CP AND WILL BE FORWARDED TO HIEU DUC ON 21 JUNE.

A CO I PLATOON HEARD MOVEMENT WEST OF THEIR POSITION (AT 930684) AT 202155H. THE AREA WAS ILLUMINATED AND THREE (3) VC WERE OBSERVED RUNNING AWAY APPROXIMATELY 35 METERS OUTSIDE THE DEFENSIVE WIRE. THE PERIMETER SECURITY PERSONNEL FIRED S/A FIRE, M-79 ROUNDS AND A GRENADE AT THE FLEEING ENEMY. A PATROL WAS DISPATCHED TO CHECK THE AREA BUT FOUND NOTHING.

THE BATTALION UTILIZED TWO (2) SCOUT-SNIPER TEAMS. ONE TEAM WAS WITH CO I AND ONE TEAM WITH CO K.

DURING THE PERIOD THE BATTALION ESTABLISHED 7 NIGHT AMBUSHES AND 10 NIGHT LISTENING POSTS. IN ADDITION, TWO (2) NIGHT COMBAT PATROLS AND 10 DAY COMBAT PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED.

21 JUNE 1966

A S/C OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED BY A CO I PATROL IN KHUONG MY (1) (AT 9268) COMMENCING AT 210600H. THE OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED WITHOUT ENCOUNTERING ENEMY FORCES.

A PATROL FROM CO I EXECUTED A S/D OPERATION IN THE VILLAGE OF KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168) AT 210700H. THE PATROL, HAVING SEARCHED THE AREA WITHOUT ENCOUNTERING THE ENEMY, RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 211000H.

THE POINT MAN OF A CO K PATROL, WHILE MOVING THROUGH DENSE UNDERBRUSH 8 FEET TALL IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 872714) AT 211150H, TRIPPED A M-26 GRENADE. THE GRENADE EXPLODED TO HIS LEFT REAR CAUSING WOUNDS TO BOTH LEGS AND HEAD. HE WAS ADMINISTERED FIRST AID AND MEDICALLY EVACUATED. PATROL CONTINUED ON MISSION AND RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 211830H.

ENCLOSURE (3)

A S/C OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED BY CO K IN THE VILLAGE OF THON NINH AN (AT 9171) COMMENCING AT 211330H. THE OPERATION WAS COMPLETED WITH NO ENEMY CONTACT. THE PATROL RETURNED AT 211700H TO ITS CP.

A CO K PATROL COMMENCED A S/D OPERATION OF THE VILLAGES OF NINH AN (1) (AT 9070) AND GIAO TRI (3) (AT 8870) AT 210700H. THE MISSION WAS COMPLETED WITHOUT ENCOUNTERING THE ENEMY. THE PATROL RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 211200H.

THE BATTALION UTILIZED 2 SCOUT-SNIPER TEAMS. ONE TEAM WAS LOCATED WITH A CO I PATROL AND ONE TEAM WAS DEPLOYED WITH A CO K PATROL.

DURING THE PERIOD, THE BATTALION ESTABLISHED 8 NIGHT AMBUSHES AND 11 LISTENING POSTS. IN ADDITION, ONE NIGHT COMBAT PATROL AND 15 DAY COMBAT PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED.

ARTILLERY CONCENTRATIONS FOR THE BATTALION WERE REGISTERED FROM 210400H TO 211000H.

22 JUNE 1966.

A CO I PATROL PROVIDING SECURITY FOR AN ENGINEER ROAD SWEEP DISCOVERED A 105 DUD IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 927705) AT 221345H. THE DUD WAS DESTROYED IN PLACE.

TWO MARINES FROM BATTERY A, 1ST BN, 12TH MARINES STOPPED A MOTOR BIKE AT 221430H IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 943712). EACH OF THE VIETNAMESE MALES ON THE BIKE HAD AN M-26 GRENADE WHICH THEY ATTEMPTED TO HIDE. THE MEN WERE TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND SENT TO 3D ITT FOR INTERROGATION.

A S/C OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED BY CO I PATROL IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 9268) AND (AT 9168) AT 220800H. THE MISSION WAS ACCOMPLISHED WITHOUT ENCOUNTER.

A PATROL FROM CO I EXECUTED A S/C OPERATION IN GS (AT 9269) COMMENCING AT 221200H. THE OPERATION WAS COMPLETED WITHOUT ENEMY CONTACT.

A CO K PATROL COMMENCED A S/D OPERATION IN GS (AT 8770) AND (AT 8770) AT 220730H. THE PATROL, HAVING SEARCHED THE OBJECTIVE AREA WITHOUT ENEMY CONTACT, RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 221200H.

A PATROL FROM CO K EXECUTED A S/D OPERATION IN GS (AT 8970) COMMENCING AT 221400H. THE MISSION WAS COMPLETED WITHOUT ENCOUNTERING THE ENEMY. THE PATROL RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 221830H.

THE BATTALION UTILIZED TWO (2) SCOUT SNIPER TEAMS. ONE TEAM WAS LOCATED WITH CO I AND ONE TEAM WAS WITH CO K.

ENCLOSURE (3)

DURING THE PERIOD, THE BATTALION ESTABLISHED 8 NIGHT AMBUSHES AND 11 LISTENING POSTS. IN ADDITION, ONE (1) NIGHT COMBAT PATROL AND 10 DAY COMBAT PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED.

AN ARTILLERY FIRE MISSION WAS EXECUTED ON A SUSPECTED VC MEETING AT (AT 892702) AT 222130H. THE MISSION WAS UNOBSERVED. A PATROL WILL CHECK THE AREA ON THE MORNING OF 23 JUNE.

23 JUNE 1966.

A PATROL FROM CO I EXECUTED A S/C OPERATION IN THE VILLAGE OF KHUONG MY (1) (AT 9268) AT 230600H. THE MISSION WAS ACCOMPLISHED ENCOUNTERING NO VC. THE PATROL RETURNED AT 230900H TO ITS CP.

A S/D OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED AT 230800H BY CO I IN THE VILLAGE OF DONG BICH (2) (AT 9068) AND KHUONG MY (4) (AT 9168). THE OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED WITHOUT VC ENCOUNTER AND AT 231100H THE PATROL RETURNED TO ITS CP.

CO I PATROL WITH AN ENGINEER ROAD SWEEP FOUND AND DESTROYED TWO (2) 105 DUDS AND ONE (1) 81 DUD IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 919697) AT 230845H.

CO I FOUND AND DESTROYED A 6'X10'X4' TUNNEL, WITH A 6'X8'X4' BRANCH TUNNEL AT 231015H IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 909699).

THE HIEU DUC DISTRICT CHIEF REPORTED TO CO I AT 231540H THAT A VC PLATOON OF 20-30 MEN HAD MOVED INTO KHUONG MY (2). A REINFORCED PLATOON WAS IMMEDIATELY DISPATCHED ON A SEARCH AND CLEAR MISSION. THE PATROL FOUND NOTHING TO SUBSTANTIATE THE REPORT AND RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 231930H.

A S/D OPERATION WAS CONDUCTED BY CO K COMMENCING AT 230700H IN THE VICINITY OF HOI VUC (AT 8770). THE PATROL, HAVING SEARCHED THE VILLAGE WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS, RETURNED TO ITS CP AT 231230H.

A PATROL FROM CO K COMMENCED A S/C OPERATION IN THE VICINITY OF THONG PHUOC HUNG (AT 9172) AT 230800H. THE MISSION WAS COMPLETED WITHOUT ENEMY ENCOUNTER. THE PATROL AT 231200H RETURNED TO ITS CP.

AN RF OPERATING WITH A CO K PATROL WAS WOUNDED BY A MINE AT 231000H IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 873705). THE MINE CONSISTED OF A CHI COM GRENADE EMPLACED 4 TO 5 FEET ABOVE, TRIGGERED BY A TRIP WIRE ON THE TRAIL. THE WOUNDED MAN WAS MED EVACED.

A CO K MARINE WAS WOUNDED WHEN HE TRIPPED A MINE IN THE VICINITY OF (AT 881706) AT 231320H. THE MINE CONSISTED OF A CHI COM GRENADE FASTENED TO A TREE AND INITIATED BY A TRIP WIRE. THE MARINE WAS MED EVACED AT 231333H. THE AREA WAS SEARCHED WITH NEGATIVE RESULTS.

A Co K patrol executed a S/D operation in the village of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) commencing at 231400H. The operation was conducted without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned to its CP at 231800H.

The battalion utilized two (2) scout-sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was located with Co K.

During the period, the battalion established 10 night ambushes and 11 listening posts. In addition, two (2) night combat patrols and 10 day combat patrols were conducted.

24 June 1966.

A Co I patrol executed a S/C operation in the village of TUY LOAN (2) (AT 9270) and (AT 9269) commencing at 240600H. The operation was conducted without incident. The patrol returned at 241100H to its CP.

The village of KIUONG MY (2) (AT 9169) was searched and cleared by a Co I patrol commencing at 240600H. The patrol, having searched the area with no enemy encounter, returned at 240900H to its CP.

A S/C operation was conducted by a Co I patrol in the village of THUOC NINH (4) (AT 9368) commencing at 240900H. During the search no enemy were encountered and at 241200H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

A Co K patrol found an uninhabited house in the vicinity of (AT 886713) at 240840H. The house appeared to have had recent occupancy. Near the house there was a tree with a ladder rested against it. The tree had a signal drum at its top. The house and ladder were destroyed. When the house was destroyed secondary explosions occurred. There were no USMC casualties. The patrol continued its mission to HOI VUC (AT 8670) where it conducted a S/D operation. The patrol encountered no enemy and returned to its CP at 241230H.

A patrol from Co K commenced a S/D operation in GIAO TRI (2) Village (AT 8670) at 241400H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned at 241645H to the Co CP.

A Co K ambush at (AT 882713) saw one VC in the brush 300 meters west of their position. The VC was taken under fire and the area was illuminated. A search of the area had negative results. The incident occurred at 242210H.

The battalion utilized two (2) scout-sniper teams. One (1) team was with Co I and one team was located with Co K.

During the period, the battalion established 9 night ambushes and 11 night listening posts. In addition, 3 night combat patrols and 9 day combat patrols were conducted.

25 June 1966.

A Co I patrol found and destroyed a 105mm dud at (AT 918694) at 251230H. There were no USMC casualties.

An electrically controlled explosive device killed one PF and wounded a Vietnamese woman in the vicinity of (AT 951688) at 251025H. The PF was a member of a C&C patrol. Immediately after the explosion the patrol received S/A fire from (AT 954692). The fire was returned but a search of the area where the fire originated had negative results. A search of the area of the explosion resulted in the discovery of a claymore type explosive device and a mine rigged M-26 grenade. A 20mm round filled with shot and capped with wax was also found. The patrol also discovered five punji traps at (AT 953683). ACO personnel who picked up the claymore type device and the booby trapped grenade stated that they were the first of those types that they had seen.

A S/C operation was conducted in the village of TUY LOAN (2) (AT 9269) and AN NHAN (2) (AT 9169) by Co I commencing at 250900H. The patrol encountered no enemy forces and returned to the Co CP at 251200H.

A Co K patrol executed a S/D operation in GS (AT 8872) and (AT 8971) at 250630H. The patrol, having searched the objective area without enemy contact returned to the Co CP at 251200H.

A patrol from Co K commenced a S/C operation of THON TRUC DONH (AT 9071) at 250700H. The patrol encountered no enemy and at 251130H returned to the Co CP.

A S/D operation was conducted by Co K in BINH THA (AT 8871) and GIAO TRI (AT 8970) commencing at 251330H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned at 251800H to the Co CP.

The battalion utilized 2 scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team with Co K.

During the period, the battalion established 11 night ambushes and 11 listening posts. In addition, 4 night combat patrols and 10 day combat patrols were conducted.

26 June 1966.

A patrol from Co I executed a S/C operation in the villages of DUONG LAM (2) (AT 9569), DUONG LAM (3) (AT 9569) and BO BAN (2) (AT 9669) commencing at 260600H. The operation was conducted without incident. The patrol returned at 261418H to the Co CP.

A Co I patrol apprehended a VC male 14 years old at (AT 966697) at 261100H. The company interpreter, stated that the boy is a VC intelligence source. The VC was delivered to HIEU DUC District Headquarters. The patrol continued its mission searching the village of TUY LOAN (1) (AT 9370). The patrol had no further contact and returned to the Co CP at 261700H.

A Co K patrol commenced a S/C operation in the village of MINH SU (1) (AT 9071) at 260800H. The patrol searched the village with no enemy contact. At 261115H the patrol returned to its CP.

A S/C operation was conducted by a Co I patrol in the village of TUY LOAN (2) (LT 9271) commencing at 261100H. The mission was accomplished without incident and the patrol returned to its CP at 261400H.

A patrol from Co K executed a S/C operation of AN TAN (LT 9171) at 261400H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned at 261830H to its CP.

A Co K patrol discovered three "L" shaped tunnels at (LT 898711) at 261830H. The tunnels were L shaped going down 12' and then in for 6'. Scraps of food were found indicating occupancy within the last 24-48 hours. Two of the tunnels were searched but nothing was found. Before searching the third tunnel a M-26 grenade was thrown in and a secondary explosion occurred which sounded like another grenade. The tunnel was searched after which all three were destroyed.

The battalion utilized two scout-sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one was with Co K.

During the period, the battalion established 9 night ambushes and 11 night listening posts. In addition, one night combat patrol and eleven day combat patrols were conducted.

27 June 1966.

A patrol from Co K commenced a S/C operation in the villages of THON TRUC DONG (LT 9071), THON PHOU C HUNG (LT 9072), THON PHU HA (LT 9073) and GIAO TRI (2) (LT 8970) at 271300H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned at 271830H to its CP.

A Co I patrol conducted S/D operations of DONG BICH (1) (LT 8968), DONG BICH (2) (LT 9068) and DONG BICH (3) (LT 8868) commencing at 270700H. The following enemy contacts were encountered:

Co I ambush at (LT 963697) shot and killed one VC at 270230H. No identification was found on the body.

Co I was informed of a mine located at (LT 919709) by a Vietnamese boy. A fire team with engineers was immediately sent to investigate. At 271015H while enroute an explosion was heard. Arriving at the reported location the patrol found a dead woman who apparently had been killed by the reported mine. The woman's wounds indicated that she may have been handling the mine in some manner.

A Co I patrol saw 2 or 3 men watching the patrol from (LT 887678) and called artillery fire on the suspected VC OP at 271445H. The VC dispersed.

A Marine in a Co I position at (LT 928682) saw a figure crawling into the position at 271230H. The Marine fired one shot killing the individual. Investigation revealed that the dead person was a Vietnamese boy. A Backlash report has been submitted to 3d Marine Division.

ENCLOSURE (3)

Co I patrol detonated a mine at (AT 899689) at 271115H. There was one Marine WIA. He was Med Evacuated. Seven Vietnamese males were observed at the time of the explosion. Six of these were nearby and fled when the patrol fired at them. The other male was out of S/A range. The patrol pursued all seven men but were unable to apprehend any.

Heavy concentrations of defensive fires were planned on trails and avenues of approach in the western portion of the 3/3 TAOR as a result of intelligence information received which indicates heavy VC movement in the area.

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team with Co K.

During the period, the battalion established 9 night ambushes and 11 listening posts. In addition, one night combat patrol and ten day combat patrols were conducted.

29 June 1966.

At 280315H, Hieu Duc District Headquarters personnel heard an explosion which appeared to have come from (AT 943692). Engineers and the district chief went to the area at 280800H to investigate. A shaped charge was found tied to the outside of a house which faced the road. A detonation wire leading inside the house was observed. The shaped charge was disarmed by the engineer team. The explosion of the night before apparently occurred at the same house, parts of which had burned. Hieu Duc officials described the incident as VC terrorism.

A patrol from Co I conducted a S/C operation of PHUOC NINH (4) (AT 9368) commencing at 280600H. The mission was accomplished without incident and at 280900H the patrol returned to its CP.

A Co I patrol commenced a S/C operation in the village of TUY LOAN (1) (AT 9370) at 280800H. The operation was conducted with negative enemy contact. The patrol returned to its CP at 281100H.

A S/C operation was conducted by Co I in the village of TUY LOAN (2) commencing at 281000H. The village was searched without encountering the enemy. At 281300H the patrol returned to its CP.

The villages of GIAO TRI (1) and GIAO TRI (3) (AT 8870) were searched by Co K patrol on a S/D mission. The patrol departed the CO at 280700H. During the operation no enemy forces were encountered. At 281200H, the patrol returned to its CP.

A Co K patrol executed a S/C operation in GS (AT 9073) at 281330H. The operation was conducted without incident. The patrol returned to the CP at 281600H.

A patrol from Co K commenced a S/C operation in the villages of NINH AN (3) and AN TAN (AT 9170) at 281400H. The mission was accomplished without incident and at 281800H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

A Combined Action Company ambush at (AT 950692) was sprung at 282030H on two VC carrying what appeared to be a thompson sub machine gun and a US carbine. The VC was observed to fall as if he was hit by fire however, neither the body nor weapon could be found. The CAC ambush returned to its CP. A patrol will be dispatched to check out the area at first light 29 June.

The battalion utilized two scout-sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team with Co K.

During the period, the battalion established 10 night ambushes and 11 night listening posts. In addition, 2 night combat patrols and 10 day combat patrols were conducted.

29 June 1966.

A Co I patrol executed a S/C operation in the village of TUY LOAN (2) (AT 9269) and (AT 9369) commencing at 290800H. The operation was conducted without incident. The patrol returned to its CP at 291900H.

A patrol from Co I conducted a S/C operation in the village of PHUOC NINH (4) (AT 9368) commencing at 290700H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned to its CP at 291000H.

The village of THON TRUC DONG (AT 9072) and (AT 9172) was searched by a Co K patrol on a S/C mission. The patrol departed at 290700H. The village was searched without encountering any enemy forces. At 291230H the patrol returned to its CP.

A Co K patrol executed a S/D operation in the village of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) at 291400H. The mission was completed without incident and at 291730H the patrol returned to the Co CP.

A Co M patrol discovered a 105mm dud at (AT 957677) at 291100H. The dud was camouflaged but was not booby trapped. Engineers destroyed the dud in place.

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing 11 night ambushes, 24 listening posts and conducting two night combat patrols. The battalion also conducted 14 day combat patrols.

30 June 1966.

A Co E patrol executed a S/C operation in the villages of PHUOC NINH (2) and DUYEN SON (5) (AT 9266), PHUOC NINH (1) (AT 9367) and PHUOC NINH (3) (AT 9267) at 300800H. No enemy forces were encountered during the operation. The patrol returned at 301300H to the Co CP.

The villages of DUONG LAM (2) and (3) (AT 9569) were searched by a Co I patrol on a S/C mission commencing at 300700H. The mission was accomplished without encountering the enemy. The patrol returned to its CP at 301700H.

At 300015H a Co I patrol spotted four VC carrying carbines at (AT 902705). The VC were taken under S/A fire while a fire team made an assault on the VC position. Upon reaching the objective three of the VC were found to have broken contact. One VC was wounded but offered fierce resistance and was killed by bayonet. One of the VC was later seen fleeing and appeared to have been wounded. The VC was pursued with negative results. Money appearing to be of a North Vietnamese origin, medical supplies, note books, maps, small batteries, and clean clothing were found near a house in the same area, which is suspected to have been the VC harboring site. The patrol continued its mission of searching and clearing the village of TU' LOAN (2) (AT 9260) and (AT 9369) without further incident. At 301100H the patrol returned to the CP. The captured material is being forwarded via the intelligence chain.

A Co K patrol executed a S/G operation in GS (AT 8973) at 300700H. The area was searched with negative results and at 301100H the patrol returned to its CP.

A patrol from Co K commenced a S/C operation in GS (AT 9172) at 300800H. The operation was conducted without enemy encounter. The patrol returned to its CP at 301200H.

The village of GIAO TRI (2) (AT 8970) was searched by a Co K patrol on a S/I mission. The patrol departed at 301400H. The mission was accomplished without enemy contact. The patrol returned at 301800H to its CP.

At 301340H a Co M patrol found two mines at (AT 953682). Each consisted of a Chi Con grenade with a trip wire stretched across the trail. Both mines were destroyed in place by engineers. There were no casualties.

A Co M patrol found two booby trapped Chi Con grenades rigged with a pressure release device next to two punji traps at (AT 956685) at 301755H. The grenades were destroyed in place. There were no casualties.

Three suspicious Vietnamese were apprehended by a CAC roadblock at (AT 924722) at 301100H. One of the men was loitering near the road block position asking many questions. One of the men claimed to be twelve years old but looked eighteen and had no ID card. The other man did not have an ID card. The captives were taken to Hieu Duc District Headquarters for further questioning.

Hieu Duc District Headquarters reported that 18 VC were hiding at (AT 916576) and that a VC platoon was believed to be harboring at (AT 963680) and (AT 960684). Patrols from Companies I and M were sent to search the area. The areas were searched but nothing was found.

The 7th Engineers are replacing the bridge at (AT 943677) which was burned by the VC on 29 June. The bridge will be replaced by a culvert. The work is expected to be completed by the morning of 1 July. A bypass has been constructed and the MSR remains trafficable.

ENCLOSURE (3)

The battalion utilized two scout sniper teams. One team was located with Co I and one team was with Co K.

The battalion continued to emphasize night activity by establishing twelve night ambushes, nineteen listening posts and conducting one night combat patrol. The battalion also conducted eighteen day combat patrols.

2. TRAINING.

a. The following battalion schools were conducted:

(1) Land Mine Warfare School: Conducted at 3d Engineer Battalion during the period 1-3 June and 6-15 June 1966. Duration of school 3 days. Classes were conducted from 0730-1745 daily. 173 personnel from this battalion successfully completed subject school.

(2) Radio Operators School: At the concerned company CP area, during the period 2-4 June 1966. Duration of school three days. Classes were conducted three hours daily. 34 personnel from this battalion successfully completed subject school.

(3) Basic Infantry Weapons Repair School: To be conducted in Okinawa during the period 27 June-10 July 1966. 4 Marines from this battalion are attending. Duration of school three weeks.

1. SITUATION.

a. Enemy forces. Annex B (Intelligence)

b. Friendly forces.

(1) 3d Marines occupies and controls assigned sector of DA NANG TAOR and defends DA NANG vital area in sector; conducts unilateral and/or coordinated operations with GVN Armed Forces within and beyond the periphery of the DA NANG TAOR; prepares to provide one (1) mobile reserve company for deployment as directed, and prepares to conduct counterattacks to restore integrity in assigned sectors.

(2) 1stBn, 3d Marines occupies and controls assigned sector of 3d Marines TAOR on northern (right flank) boundary.

(3) 2dBn, 3d Marines occupies and controls assigned sector of 3d Marines TAOR on southern (left flank) boundary.

(4) 3dMarDiv units occupy and control rear areas on eastern boundary, south to (AT 970699).

(5) 3dBn, 1st Marines occupies and controls assigned sector of 9th Marines TAOR on eastern boundary between (AT 970699) and (AT 959683).

(6) FMAW conducts air operations, providing offensive air support, anti-air warfare, service support, aerial reconnaissance, and control of assigned missiles and aircraft.

(7) 3d Recon Bn(-) (Rein) general support 3d Marine Division.

(8) Combined Action Company Platoons No. 1 and No. 2 are located at (AT 945698) and (AT 921724) respectively. Conduct patrols and ambushes in defense of assigned villages/hamlets.

(9) Hieu Duc District Headquarters is located at (AT 934689) with "New Life" Hamlet in La Chau (1) (AT 944685).

(10) Btry "A" 1stBn, 12th Marines direct support.

(11) ___ Plat, Co A, 3d ATBn direct support.

(12) ___ Plat, Co A, 3d EngrBn direct support.

(13) ___ Plat (-), Co A, 9th MTBn direct support.

(14) ___ Plat, Co A, 3d TkbN direct support.

c. Attachments and Detachments. Annex A (Task Organization).

2. MISSION. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines conducts offensive operations in assigned zone of action to destroy VC forces, facilities and influence within the ZOA; occupies, clears and controls present uncleared areas; conducts County Fair type operations and local security in semi-cleared areas; defends assigned zone of action from enemy attack; defends vital areas in zone of action; conducts reconnaissance operations; prepares to execute offensive operations beyond the zone of action in coordination with GVN military forces; and assumes operational control of Popular Force units located within the zone of action.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operation. When relieved as Airbase Defense Battalion by 1st Military Police Battalion on D-Day, 3d Battalion (-) (Rein), 3d Marines assumes responsibility with three reinforced rifle companies for a new Zone of Action as delineated in Annex C (Operation Overlay). Commencing D-3 one MF platoon per day will arrive in Sectors Oscar, Victor and Uniform respectively to commence relief of Companies K, M, and I.

Continuing D-2 Companies K, M, and I relieve Companies G, F and E. 2d Battalion, 3d Marines, in place, relieving one-third of each unit fully on D-2, D-1 and D-Day. Company K, M and I command groups, and base 51st mortar sections will relieve respective 2dBn, 3d Marines units on D-Day. Company L continues current mission in current locations, and comes under the operational control of 1st MP Battalion on D-Day until on or about 1 August 1966. Within the new Zone of Action, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines conducts controlled and coordinated offensive operations in a deliberate, detailed, systematic and thorough clearing of VC forces and complete destruction of VC facilities and influence within the zone of action. Semi-cleared areas are those areas to the rear of frontline units. Uncleared areas are those areas forward of frontline units. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines will conduct County Fair type operations on suitable targets within semi-cleared areas. Within the zone of action, 3d Battalion, 3d Marines conducts patrols and ambushes; utilizes scout-sniper teams against the enemy; establishes observation posts for surveillance over enemy avenues of approach; makes maximum use of listening posts for early detection of enemy approach; and coordinates with CAC and GVN forces for combined operations within zone of action.

b. Co I (Rein).

- (1) On D-5 send 3 advance party members to position at (AT 930683).
- (2) On D-4 send 3 advance party members to position at (AT 922704).
- (3) On D-3 send Company Headquarters advance party to Co H, 2dBn, 3d Marines CP at (AT 924691).
- (4) On D-2 relieve Co H, 2/3, platoon (Rein) in place at (AT 930683).
- (5) On D-1 relieve Co H, 2/3, platoon (Rein) in place at (AT 922704).
- (6) On D-Day, relieve Co H, 2/3, Company Command Group and platoon (Rein) in place at (AT 924691). Attach ARVN detachment from Co H Attach Light Sec. Ontos, one Engr. Team, two (2) Scout-Sniper Teams, and one (1) Artillery FO Team.
- (7) Occupy positions as indicated in Annex C (Operation Overlay).
- (8) Conduct aggressive patrols and ambushes in assigned sector.
- (9) Maintain surveillance over enemy avenues of approach.
- (10) Make maximum use of listening posts for early detection of enemy approach.

(11) Maintain close liaison with Vietnamese civil and military agencies within assigned sector.

(12) Assume responsibility for Song Tuy Loan River from (AT 928711) to (AT 969699), and for Song Vam River from (AT 969699) to (AT 960603).

(13) Prepare to conduct County Fair type operations within semi-cleared areas of assigned sector.

(14) Provide daily security details for engineer roadsweep teams to Kieu Duc District Headquarters. Engineer mine-detection teams will sweep road to (AT 942688), where teams will split and one team will sweep to North, and one team will sweep to South in coordination with Co E, 2/3, engineer team sweeping from Hill 41 (AT 934663).

(15) Conduct civic action in assigned sector.

(16) Be prepared to support CAC #1 with supporting fires, if requested.

c. Co K (Rein).

(1) On D-8 send 3 advance party members to positions at (AT 889727), (AT 905718) and (AT 914714), to return on D-6.

(2) On D-6 send 3 advance party members to each of the above positions, to return on D-4.

(3) On D-3 send Co Headquarters advance party to Co G, 2d Bn, 3d Marines CP at (AT 905718).

(4) On D-2 relieve one-third each Co G, 2/3, units in place at above three positions.

(5) On D-1 relieve one-third each Co G, 2/3, units in place at above three positions.

(6) On D-Day, relieve Co G, 2/3, Company Command Group and remaining one-third Co G units in place at above three locations. Attach ARVN detachment from Co G. Attach Light Section Tanks, one Engr Team, two (2) Scout-Sniper Teams, and one Artillery FO Team.

(7) Occupy positions as indicated in Annex C (Operation Overlay).

(8) Conduct aggressive patrols and ambushes in assigned sector.

(9) Maintain surveillance over enemy avenues of approach.

(10) Make maximum use of listening posts for early detection of enemy approach.

(11) Maintain close liaison with Vietnamese civil and military agencies within assigned sector.

(12) Assume responsibility for Song Tuy Loan River on left flank eastward to (AT 928711), and thence northward to right flank boundary (AT 905745).

(13) Prepare to conduct County Fair type operations within semi-cleared areas of assigned sector.

(14) Conduct civic action in assigned sector.

(15) Be prepared to support CAC #2 with supporting fires, if requested.

d. Co M (Rein).

(1) On D-7 send 12 advance party members to positions at (AT 950721), (AT 942721) and (AT 948699), to return on D-5.

(2) On D-5 send 12 advance party members to above positions, to return on D-3.

(3) On D-3 send Co Headquarters advance party to 2d Bn, 3d Marines CP at (AT 950721).

(4) On D-2 provide one platoon (Rein) to occupy position at (AT 950721), and one squad (Rein) to relieve 2d Bn, 3d Marine unit in place at pontoon bridge at (AT 948699).

(5) On D-1 provide one platoon (-) (Rein) to occupy position at (AT 942721), and one squad (Rein) to occupy outpost position at (AT 935718).

(6) On D-Day displace Co M Command Group and remaining Co M elements to 2/3 CP at (AT 950721), occupy positions as indicated in Annex C (Operation Overlay), and assume responsibility for assigned sector. Attach ARVN detachment left at 2/3 CP by Co F, one Engr Team, one Scout-Sniper Team, and one Artillery FO Team.

(7) Conduct aggressive patrols and ambushes in assigned sector.

(8) Maintain surveillance over enemy avenues of approach, paying particular attention to those leading vicinity of 3d MarDiv CP (AT 955749).

(9) Make maximum use of listening posts for early detection of enemy approach.

(10) Maintain close liaison with Vietnamese civil and military agencies within assigned sector.

(11) Assume responsibility for MSR in assigned sector (Annex D-MSR Overlay), including the road extending from (AT 912743) to (AT 939713), and the road extending from the pontoon bridge (AT 948699) to (AT 958717).

(12) Prepare to conduct County Fair type operations within assigned sector.

(13) Conduct civic action in assigned sector.

(14) Provide one corpsman daily at 1000H from pontoon bridge squad to assist with "sick call" held at Vietnamese hospital (AT 944698).

(15) Provide one platoon as Battalion Reserve.

(16) Be prepared to conduct "Rough Rider" North on order with one platoon (Rein).

(17) Be prepared to reinforce CAU #1 and/or #2, if ordered.

(18) Be prepared on order, to provide Company (-) blocking or counter-attack force vicinity eastern flank of Battalion Zone of Action in event Da Nang Airbase is mortared, or MSP #1 is attacked.

(19) Be prepared to reinforce reconnaissance teams operating forward of, and/or within, Battalion Zone of Action, on order.

e. Co I. (Rein).

(1) Continue current mission in current locations.

(2) Report to the operational control of the Commanding Officer, 1st MP Battalion, on order, on D-Day.

(3) Be prepared to shift tactical radio frequencies to 1st MP Bn tactical nets upon reporting.

(4) Be prepared to rejoin this Headquarters on or about 1 Aug 1966.

f. U&S Co (-).

(1) On D-6 displace U&S Co members of CAC to CAC Platoon locations at (AT 945696) and (AT 921724).

(2) Commencing D-3 displace U&S Co advance party to new CP location (AT 950721).

(3) On D-1 resume operational control of 106mm Platoon and Flame Section from Co M, and displace same to new CP location. Provide two radio operators to Hieu Luc District Headquarters (AT 934689) as Battalion Liaison Team at that location. Maintain one alert platoon as Airbase Defense Battalion Reserve at Airbase Battalion CP on night of D-1.

(4) Complete displacement of U&S Co to new CP location on D-Day. Displace and maintain one section 81mm Mortar Platoon in general support at new CP location.

(5) Provide Battalion CP security at new location.

(6) Provide one corpsman to Vietnamese hospital at (AT 945698) at 1000H daily to assist with conduct of "sick call".

(7) Maintain one alert platoon trained and ready on call.

g. 81mm Mortar Platoon.

(1) One section direct support of Co I (Rein).

(2) One section direct support of Co K (Rein).

(3) One section direct support of Co L (Rein).

(4) One section general support.

h. Battalion Reserve: One rifle platoon, Co H (Rein).

(1) Be prepared to conduct such operations as directed.

i. Coordinating Instructions.

(1) See Annex A (Operation Overlay)

(2) Submit overlays of defensive positions and fire support plans by 1200H on D+2.

(3) Submit a schematic showing location of tactical and protective wire, Claymores emplaced, crew-served weapons positions, primary and alternate armored vehicle positions, and bunker positions by 1200H on D+4.

(4) Claymore mines emplaced must be covered by observation and fire at all times, to prevent removal or turning around. Claymores will be disarmed during daylight hours, unless attack is imminent. Report the coordinates of emplaced Claymores to this Headquarters within 48 hours of emplacement, except that patrols and ambushes not in a permanent or semi-permanent posture do not have to report Claymore weapons unless emplaced over 24 hours in duration.

(5) Make maximum utilization of listening posts within small arms range of defensive positions. Coordinate prearranged signals and routes of withdrawal for all listening posts and report location of listening posts to this Headquarters with daily patrol/ambush overlays. Listening posts will have positive means of communications (wire, radio, or both) with their parent units. Specific plans for re-establishing communications, in event of communications failure, will be developed before any listening post departs its parent unit's area. As a general policy, listening posts will not open fire except when necessary in own defense.

(6) Commanding Officers are directed to make maximum effective use of Scout-Sniper personnel in the conduct of all operations, and to report their performance in daily Situation Reports. Guidelines for the operational use of Scout/Snipers are:

(a) Scout/Snipers are not equipped for a regular infantry role and will not be used as such.

(b) Scout/Snipers are not equipped with snoper scopes and are not to be utilized in night operations. This is not intended to prohibit night time positioning of Scout/Snipers.

(c) Scout/Snipers will not be utilized unless accompanied by adequate infantry security.

(d) Whenever Scout/Snipers are utilized plans will include means of reinforcing or extracting them should the need arise.

(e) Company Commanders will select the areas in which Scout/Snipers will operate and will insure that they are utilized to the maximum extent possible.

(f) The smallest integral unit to be utilized operationally will be the two-man sniper team; plus infantry security.

(6) The positive communication requirements as specified in par (5) above apply to Scout/ Sniper units.

(7) As general policy, 75% of each unit's combat operations will be conducted during hours of darkness.

(8) The minimum size unit for a patrol is the squad, reinforced with a radio communications capability. At no time may any patrol number less than eight (8) men.

(9) All patrols will have an FO capability. A patrol is considered to have FO capability when the patrol leader has radio communication with his parent unit, and is capable of calling and adjusting supporting fires.

(10) Units will have designated elements prepared to immediately deploy to reinforce all listening posts, patrols and ambushes.

(11) Patrols, ambushes and isolated defensive positions will contain at least 8 men, and will have positive means of communication (wire, radio, or both) with their parent unit. Specific plans for re-establishing communications, in event of communications failure, will be developed before any of these combat activities depart its parent unit's area.

(12) Commanders shall establish a system of positive communication checks with all combat activities operating outside of base camp locations. Such checks shall be conducted at least once each hour, as a minimum. Specific plans for re-establishing communications, in event of communications failure, will be developed before any combat activity departs its parent unit's area. Inform this Headquarters immediately when communications contact is lost with any subordinate unit.

(13) Patrol overlays will be submitted to this Headquarters (Attn: S-3) by 1200H daily and 96 hours in advance. Charges for patrol activities will be submitted to this Headquarters (Attn: S-3) by 1200H and 24 hours in advance of scheduled activity.

(14) All patrols must have checkpoints indicated on overlays. Checkpoints will be shown in black, and ambush sites in red, on patrol overlays.

(15) Rules of Engagement are in effect and are as follows:

(a) Individual.

1. Rounds will not be chambered in individual weapons unless contact with the enemy is imminent. The senior Marine present will determine if, in his judgement, this measure must be taken to preserve the lives of USMC personnel.

1. Initiation of any offensive or defensive formation implies imminent contact with the enemy.
2. Magazines will not be inserted in weapons in a camp area during daylight hours unless under attack.
3. During the hours of darkness the sequence of engagement will be:
 - a. Challenge
 - b. If the person challenged makes an overt attempt to avoid apprehension, opens fire or commits any other hostile act, and therefore endangers the life of the challenger, the challenger may load and fire.
 - c. Unit Commanders may prescribe illumination prior to firing if local circumstances allow.
 - d. The requirement for challenge may be waived by the local commander if required by the tactical situation and friendly forces are known to be in the area.

(b) Unit.

1. Supporting arms will not be fired into any populated area except when the infantry commander on the ground personally determines that such action is necessary to save Marine lives, and that there is no alternative to such a course of action.
2. All supporting arms missions except pre-planned barrages will be approved positively at the appropriate FSCC level prior to the use of supporting arms.
3. None of the foregoing is intended to deny the application of force against the source of hostile fires. Enemy forces engaging friendly troops will be destroyed by utilization of any available means.

(16) Rules of Engagement for traffic on waterways are in effect and are as follows:

- a. During daylight hours, watercraft not responding to hail or challenge are to be warned by firing warning shots into the air, or across the boat's bow.

If personnel in the boat perform a hostile act, or continue to commit an obvious attempt to avoid apprehension, units may open fire on boat.

b. During the hours of darkness, except for craft of U. S. and allied forces, any craft moving on inland waterways may be fired upon if there is a reasonable suspicion that it is transporting enemy personnel, weapons, or supplies. All friendly boats should be carrying a light during curfew hours in 3d Bn, 3d Marines Zone of Action.

c. All craft, except for those of U. S. and allied forces, are subject at any time to pursuit, detention and search if there is a reasonable suspicion that the craft are transporting or harboring enemy personnel, weapons or supplies.

d. Craft moving during daylight hours which are stopped and searched on the basis of reasonable suspicion will be permitted to proceed if the search produces negative results. Craft stopped and searched during the hours of darkness will be detained until daylight even if the search produces negative results.

(17) Curfew hours for indigenous personnel in 3d Bn, 3d Marines Zone of Action are from 2000H until 0500H daily.

(18) The pontoon bridge at (AT 946700) shall be closed to vehicular traffic each day at darkness, and re-opened the following morning only after the engineer minesweep detail has completed sweeping the road to the south of the bridge.

(19) Except under condition of emergency, no military vehicles are to proceed on roads within the 3d Bn, 3d Marines Zone of Action between the hours of 1900H daily and first light.

(20) Vehicles will not be permitted to proceed south of the pontoon bridge (AT 946700), or to the west of the road intersection at (AT 912743), unless in convoy of two or more vehicles and with a minimum of one "shotgun" per vehicle. Vehicles maintain adequate distances to minimize effects of mines and/or ambushes.

(21) No individual is to proceed alone from any unit position within the Battalion Zone of Action.

(22) Marines of this Battalion shall habitually employ the "Buddy System", as a minimum personnel security measure, within or outside the Battalion Zone of Action.

(23) Armored vests will be worn in all night defensive positions, and will be available for immediate use in all day defensive positions. Armored vests will be worn on all patrols, ambushes and offensive operations unless otherwise authorized by this Headquarters.

(24) On defensive positions in which bunkers are constructed, the general policy shall be that bunkers will be used for living/sleeping spaces, with adjacent fighting positions constructed from which Marines will fight.

(25) Employment of Supporting Arms.

(a) All artillery fires must be approved through this Headquarters.

(b) All 81mm preplanned on-call and H&I fires must be approved through this Headquarters.

(c) All prop fires must be approved through this Headquarters.

(d) All 60mm H&I fires must be approved through this Headquarters.

(e) 81mm illumination, WP and HE fires are to be requested and approved through this Headquarters, except in those cases in which the Company Commander deems an emergency to exist. In such cases, Company Commanders are delegated the authority to fire 81mm illumination, WP or HE fires in his Zone of Action, and to report subject fire missions to this Headquarters at the earliest opportunity.

(f) Barrages and defensive concentrations will be registered upon coordination and approval of this Headquarters.

(g) Units are to habitually register night defensive concentrations whenever possible when operating from patrol bases.

(h) Units will plan on-call concentrations along routes of all patrols and/or ambushes.

(i) All indirect fires of the 106mm Platoon, Tanks, and Jats must be approved by this Headquarters.

(j) Mortar positions will have air sentries posted whenever firing is in progress.

(k) Upon displacing to the new Zone of Action, the Company Commander may displace 60mm mortars at his discretion. 81mm Mortar sections attached to Companies I and K, and the 81mm Mortar Section in general support, will displace to new location in the new Zone of Action on order, on D-Day.

(l) In the employment of supporting arms, every effort will be made to preserve religious structures, medical facilities, public utilities, and cultural areas.

(m) Air Strikes.

- (1) Submit all air requests to FSCG, this Headquarters.
- (2) TACP or TAC (A) will control all close air support.
- (3) Mark front lines with air panels and/or yellow or green smoke when conducting close air support.

(26) All units/patrols will carry air panels and be prepared to utilize SPARROW HAWK. SPARROW HAWK squad will be provided by 3d Marines.

(27) Fire coordination along the Song Yen River between 3d and 9th Marines units is as follows:

(1) Targets in and/or on the Song Yen River may be pursued by fire by either Regiment without prior coordination.

(2) Physical pursuit into and/or on the Song Yen River must have prior coordination.

(28) Submit operational reports to this Headquarters in accordance with reference (n), except that overlays are to be submitted 96 vice 72 hours in advance. Make Spot Reports as "Initial", "Amplifying" and "Final" whenever the situation allows.

(29) Rice captured during operations will not be destroyed, except under unusual circumstances, without prior approval of this Headquarters.

(30) All units continuously review counter-attack plans for their defensive positions.

(31) Emphasize camouflage measures in offensive and defensive activities.

(32) Emphasize communication security measures.

(33) Make maximum use of infra-red devices, AN/TTS-21, and seismic intrusion detection devices.

(34) Pay particular attention to providing adequate security for wiremen/wire teams when checking/installing lines; for engineers when wire-sweeping roads; and for mile/vehicle men in isolated areas.

(35) Reference (o) provides guidance for the use of fire and maneuver, cover and concealment, ambushes, reaction, and dispersion. All units continuously emphasize and demand tactical dispersion of troops.

(36) Reference (p) provides guidance for passive defensive measures in offensive operations.

(37) Reference (q) provides instructions and safety precautions for the use and handling of hand grenades. Dud hand grenades are to be blown in place by qualified personnel. Strict ammunition accountability is to be maintained among all units.

(38) RCA authorized within zone of action.

(39) Buying from local vendors is prohibited. Only authorized indigenous personnel are to be granted access to any unit position.

(40) This plan effective for planning on receipt; execution on order.

(41) DIRLAUTH all units.

(42) Tentative D-Day is 16 June 1966.

(43) Contact right to left.

(44) All units are instructed to leave Da Nang Airbase areas in a high state of police. Company Commanders inspect assigned Airbase sectors with incoming unit Commanders, and inform this Headquarters of the results of inspection.





 - (4) Be alert to observe and report any unusual enemy positions, such as artillery emplacements.



1. MISSION. As defined in the basic order.

2. SITUATION:

a. Weather. See Appendix 5 (Climatology) to Annex B (Intelligence).

b. Terrain.

- (1) Terrain in the northeastern portion of the ZOA is characterized by the NUI CAM KHE Hill mass rising to a height of 327 meters.
- (2) The east-central and southern portions of the ZOA are characterized by low-lying flat land utilized for wet-land rice and dry-land crops. These paddy areas extend westerly and northerly from the eastern and southern boundaries for an average distance of 3,000 meters.
- (3) The central portion of the ZOA is characterized by hills rising to a height of 270 meters, and numerous small valleys.
- (4) The western boundary of the ZOA extends along the ridge line of high hills that rise to an elevation of between 500 to 1,000 meters.
- (5) Foot traffic can move freely throughout the ZOA except during the rainy season lasting from September to late December ~~or~~ early January. During this period the Song Tuy Loan becomes a major obstacle. The existing road not may be considered as all-weather, although some portions were closed for short periods during the last monsoon season.
- (6) There are two rivers within the ZOA. The SONG TUY LOAN flows from west to east and roughly bisects the ZOA.
 There is a civilian foot bridge and a military pontoon bridge spanning the river at AT 946699 which can accommodate all military traffic. The other river, the SONG YEN, delineates the southeastern boundary of the ZOA, and therefor is no obstacle to vehicular traffic within the ZOA Boundary.

- (7) Observation of the high ground of the ZOA is possible from the high ground of the ZOA.

c. Population. The civil population is governed by the military commander for the district. Authority is delegated to village and hamlet chiefs who are appointed officials subordinate to the District Chief. The District Chief is an appointed military officer (Capt) who is both the civil administrator and military commander of the district.

- (1) Economics. Agriculture and livestock are the primary means of economic income for the local population.
- (2) Transportation. Transportation is generally by foot, supplemented by many bicycles and a few scooters. There are some local buses that carry passengers and produce during the daylight hours.
- (3) Religion. The overall religion in the area is Roman Catholic; however, there are some Buddhist hamlets within the ZOA.
- (4) Language. Vietnamese is the basic language; some of the older people, however, are able to speak French. The school-age children are rapidly accustoming themselves to English.

d. Enemy Forces.

- (1) See Current INTSUMS issued by 3d Marines
- (2) As a rule, the enemy can be expected to make use of the hours of limited surveillance before launching any attack. The VC possess only a limited crew-served weapon fire support capability. To neutralize our fire support advantage they can be expected to attack on nights without moon and on nights without a moon and on nights of heavy rain or fog. Generally, attacks will end by 0300 hours to permit the enemy time to re-secure the protection of the mountains before dawn. Viet Cong attacks will usually be planned as raids. They will not normally attempt to hold any ground taken. Their primary objective will be to inflict casualties and seize equipment and materials.
- (3) Enemy mining activities have been increasing within the ZOA while the incidents of S/A fire have decreased, indicating a lack of weapons and/or ammunition on the part of the enemy.

- (4) Local intelligence sources (District Headquarters) have reported increasing numbers of "Hard Core" units within the ZOA. These units are considered well armed and trained. Although these reports have not been substantiated by contact with the enemy, there does appear to be a trend toward mobilization of large units, particularly in the mountainous region on the western boundary of the ZOA.

3. POSSIBLE ENEMY COURSES OF ACTION.

a. Continue present course of avoiding contact.

Enumeration. Present reports indicate that numerous Viet Cong agents are operating within the ZOA. Because of numerous patrols throughout the area necessitating contact with the local populace, and because of the close proximity of indigenous farmlands to friendly positions, it is reasonable to assume that the enemy will continue to employ agents for observing and collecting intelligence information.

b. Adopt tactics of harassment and terrorism.

Enumeration. The civilian population in the area has been generally friendly towards American forces. Particularly, village and hamlet chiefs have made a determined effort toward working with American forces. An attitude of mutual trust has been created. Because of the Viet Cong's need to alienate the people from the government, a program of harassment and terrorism against the population and against friendly forces could be initiated.

- c. Adopt an aggressive mining and booby trap program.

Enumeration. Due to the lack of attacks and the few incidents of mining in the area, it is indicated that the enemy suffers a shortage of weapons and ammunition. In order to maintain a quasi-control of the area, the enemy must initiate an aggressive campaign of mining and booby traps.

- d. Launch a concentrated attack on Marine positions within the ZOA.

Enumeration. Recent local intelligence sources indicate an increase of Viet Cong forces within the ZOA. These reports have not been substantiated by contact with the reported units. There was only one incident of concerted action by the enemy against a reinforced patrol. Recent reverses, especially during the rice harvest, increase the need for an impressive Viet Cong victory to regain lost prestige.

- e. Withdraw from the ZOA.

Enumeration. Since the population in the area has been generally pro-government, and Marine defensive positions are well established, plus the aggressive program of night and day patrolling which precludes the enemy from massing any sizable force, the Viet Cong could decide to employ their "Main Force" units in another area where their chances of success may be greater.

4. CONCLUSIONS.

- a. Due to the fact that there have been no incidents of concerted unit actions against friendly positions, plus the fact that mining and booby trap incidents are steadily increasing, it is felt that the enemy does not possess the personnel and/or weapons to launch a major attack against friendly positions. It is felt that the enemy will continue this campaign of mining, in conjunction with harassment and terrorism against the civil population, to maintain a quasi-control of the area. It is not felt that the enemy will withdraw completely from the area as this would be too great a loss of prestige from which they might never recover.
- b. It is felt that the Viet Cong will employ their possible courses of action in the following sequence:
- (1) Course a. in conjunction with course c.
 - (2) Course b.
 - (3) Course d.
 - (4) Course e.

1. The Viet Cong rely heavily on the collection of intelligence before planning any attack or harassment of friendly forces. The employment of women and young children to gather intelligence information is widely used by the VC.
2. As an aid in combatting the collection effort of the VC it is imperative that certain actions be initiated by our forces. These actions include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. All military documents will be hand-held while vehicles are standing to preclude their being snatched by a passer-by. Documents will not be taken into Vietnamese markets or shops.
 - b. Military matters are not to be discussed with Armed Forces of Vietnam personnel unless expressly approved by the Battalion Commander.
 - c. Within the DA NANG area personnel working with Viet Cong units have been noted to be Negroid and Caucasian, as well as Oriental. They have been known to wear friendly unit uniforms. It is imperative that unknown or suspicious acting persons within close proximity to friendly positions be identified.
 - d. Care will be taken to keep all indigenous personnel clear of areas of observation. This policy must be applied with common sense. It does not mean that civilians will be removed from their normal living and working areas.
3. Wide use of the sign and countersign must be initiated during the hours of darkness or poor visibility to preclude the infiltration of friendly positions during those times.

Appendix 5 (Climatology) to Annex B (Intelligence) to Operation Plan 5-66

1. PRECIPITATION.

- a. The monsoon climate prevails throughout South Vietnam. The country is affected by the westerly and southwesterly monsoon, resulting in a rainy season for the Delta area and the interior mountainous and plateau region extending from early May until late October or early November. On the other hand, the northeastern coast (DA NANG) has a rainy season that is much shorter, extending from September to late December or early January.
- b. Generally, 75 to 90 percent of the annual rainfall occurs during the monsoon season.
- c. See Tab A (Climatological Data) to Appendix 5 (Climatology).

2. HUMIDITY. (See Tab A)

3. TEMPERATURES. (See Tab A)

4. CLOUD COVERAGE. (See Tab A)

5. VISIBILITY.

- a. The normal mental picture of the rainy season is that of constant rainfall. Actually, this is not the case. Generally, there is an average of four to five hours of sunshine a day.
- b. During the monsoon season, the average number of hours of sunshine per day in the DA NANG area is 4.9 hours. This represents approximately 41 percent of normal 12 hours of possible sunshine per day.

6. GRACHIN.

- a. Grachin is a prolonged period of widespread fog and light rain or drizzle which primarily affects the northeastern coastal area. It is a persistent low-level stratus phenomenon accompanied by prolonged drizzle, and therefore greatly affects aircraft operations.
- b. The tops of the stratus layer easily extends above 6,000 feet; clear, dry air is usually found above this layer. The clouds

are generally 3,000 to 5,000 feet thick, with halos below 1,000 feet and frequently below 500 feet. Visibility is generally below two miles, and frequently below one half mile.

- c. The Grachin may first appear as early as October, but usually does not become common until late November. It is most frequent in December and disappears by late April.
- d. This phenomenon generally occurs in recurring periods of two to five days duration. Over a five-year period (1952-56), the Grachin was reported on an average of 41 days per year in the Da NANG area.



 - d. The hamlet is similar to the American Village or the suburb of a city (as a rule, several hamlets combine to form a village).




