7. Morale, PX, Postal Affairs, Liberty, R&R

a. Morale is considered to be excellent to outstanding.
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b. PX services were made available to three companies in the field through the mobile exchange. A sufficient supply of SP rations were available for the necessary health and comfort items.

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c. Postal Affairs are unsatisfactory.

d. Liberty was not authorized during the period.

e. The R&R program continues to be a major morale factor within this command. There were 114 out-of-country R&R quotas utilized during this reporting period.

8. Civil Affairs, Military Government, Community Relations

None, due to the tactical location of the battalion during the period.

ENCLOSURE (1)

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1. Significant Events. The advent of April saw the end of Operation Prairie III, at 2400H 19 April 1967, and the commencement of Prairie IV, at 0001 April 1967.

A Battalion (-) search and destroy mission was held in the western sector of the TAOR. A change of enemy tactics is apparent; with the initiation of a vehicular ambush. The ambush was well constructed; triggered by a anti-vehicle mine; and accompanied by hand explosives, mortars and small arms weapons.

It is also noted an increase of firing at helicopters with S/A's and one incident by a 50 caliber machine gun.

2. New Developments. The most pertinent happenings were the returning of V.C. Returnees (Montagnards), at three different dates. Currently 63 on 1 April, 49 on 5 April and 14 on 7 April 1967. All these were questioned and it should be noted, that, they reported maltreatment by their V.C. capturers and were significantly suffering from malnutrition.

3. Problem Areas. The AN/TPS-21 continues to be a grave problem due to the fact that, elements of it have not been in use since Dec. 66.

The AN/PRS-1 continues to be lacking within the battalion.

4. Weather. The weather for the month of April has been clear, sunny days, with at times scattered showers and concentrated humidity. The mean high low for the month respectively were 80 degrees and 72 degrees, with visibility at seven miles and precipitation at 7.94 inches. The general out-look has been slightly cloudy and widely scattered showers.

5. Intelligence Summaries. A decisive increase in enemy activities is prevalent, indicated by 4 mines and 2 bow and arrow type booby-traps incidents, which have been discovered. For further significant events see paragraph 1.

6. Daily Intelligence Summaries. See Appendix I.

7. Special Intelligence Summaries. None.

8. Prisoner Report. Three groups of V.C. Returnees (Montagnards). First group of 3 on 1 April 1967. Second group of 49 on 5 April 1967. Third group of 40 on April 1967. A total of 152.

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S-3 CHRONOLOGY1. Significant Events.

1 April 1967. At 010225H Company Mike received 6-8 rounds of incoming mortar rounds. Counter fire returned with excellent reaction time. Results of action, 1 USMC WIA.

At 011355H coordinates (965522) Company India patrol apprehended four VCS. At Battalion S-2 interpreter interrogated VCS and the information received was that they are Montgards from village 38. No military information gained.

2 April 1967. At 021620H it was reported by Battalion S-3 that aircraft has received small arms fire from vicinity of (982532). Artillery mission fired. Results unknown.

At 021045H coordinates (982532) a Marine from 3d Battalion, 3d Marines was injured by accidental discharge by another Marine's M-16. Weapon was discharged at close range, injuring man in lower abdomen. Emergency MedEvac requested. Investigation underway. At 021930H location 3d Battalion, 3d Marines Command Post emergency MedEvac was completed.

3 April 1967. At 030750H Co. "I" 3d platoon departed this position for the Khe Gio Bridge for security in that position.

At 030955H coordinates (965596) Co. "I" spotted four NVA moving in a NB direction. Unable to determine uniform and equipment due to extreme distance. Artillery mission called. Results unknown.

At 031413H Co. "I" spotted 2 NVA in brown utilities and soft camouflaged covers moving in a NB direction. No weapons were observed. Arty. mission called in with excellent coverage of target. Results unknown.

4 April 1967. At 041233H Co. "I" 3d Battalion, 3d Marines was relieved of Khe Gio Bridge responsibility by Co. "I" 3d Battalion, 9th Marines. Co. "I" 3d Battalion, 9th Marines arrived this position at 041233H.

At 041945 coordinates (959565) Mike Co. 1st platoon observed 2 suspected NVA with lights on trail. Unable to determine uniforms color and if suspected NVA armed due to darkness. Arty. mission fire with excellent target coverage.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

5 April 1967. At 050900 vicinity of Company Kilo CP a Marine from Company Kilo burned both arms by hot grease. Priority MedEvac requested. At 050945H MedEvac Completed.

At 051400H at coordinates (953974) Company Mike 3d platoon found a human skeleton and dog tags. Information on dog tags read as follows: KNOWLTON, B.W., Service Number 2114543, USMC, M, Catholic, A. Remains of utility shirt and PFC chevrons also found showed effects of artillery or mortar blasts. Helmet with shrapnel dents found near remains and appeared to be several months old. Remains and dog tags held at 3d Battalion, 3d Marines, Command Post.

6 April 1967. At 060700H at coordinates (965576) an Observation Post at Company Mike Command Post observed what appeared to be a water buffalo moving west. Overcast was heavy to see if animal was carrying any equipment. 81mm mortar mission called. Excellent coverage on target.

At 060930H at coordinates (952495) a Marine from Company India slipped and fell injuring his back. A priority MedEvac has been requested. At 061055H at coordinates (952495) Company India completed priority and one additional MedEvac.

At 061235H at coordinates (944496) Company India found four suspected NVA bunkers four by six by five feet with logs overhead. No equipment found. Bunkers appeared to be occupied approximately one month ago. Bunkers destroyed.

7 April 1967. At 071600H fifteen men, thirteen women, and twelve children returnees, forwarded this date time group via trucks to Cam Lo district Headquarters as ordered.

8 April 1967. At 081935 coordinates (998477) Company Kilo reported one civilian killed and four wounded. Preliminary investigation indicated that no 3d Battalion, 3d Marines H&I fires (Artillery or Mortars) fired in the vicinity of the village.

At 081600H coordinates (959601). Company Mike patrol located old mortar position, approximately four months old. Within area found 1 - 82mm dud, rubber plugs, blood stain trousers and two tennis shoes. Area showed good results of being hit by counter mortar fire.

At 082100H coordinates (964570). Company Mike ambush received approximately 15 rounds of small arms fire. 81mm mortar fire mission called with excellent target coverage. Results unknown. One USMC WIA.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

9 April 1967. At 091950 coordinates (998477). Detailed investigation revealed that one civilian was killed and five civilians wounded. Investigation also revealed that it was not an H&I fire that caused the damage but plotted artillery mission sweeping zone fire 300x300, from this position. A Serious Incident Report has been forwarded to 3d Marines.

10 April 1967. At 101600H coordinates (978557) Company Mike OP on Rock Pile received one sniper round from cave at south end of Rock Pile. Returned small arms fire and M-79 fire. Area well covered.

11 April 1967. At 111245 the remainder of Company Mike 3d Battalion, 9th Marines arrived this Command Post. At 111300H helilift commenced for 3d Battalion, 3d Marine search and destroy operation.

At 111445H coordinates (981542) 3d Battalion, 3d Marines completed helilift from 3d Battalion, 3d Marines Command Post.

At 111430 at coordinates (927496) Company Lima found approximately fifteen well camouflaged and well built bunkers plus assorted 782 gear.

At 111450 at coordinates (927496) Company Lima found two graves with markers and with names and dates on them approximately two weeks old.

At 111500 at coordinates (928495) Company Lima found approximately twenty-five bunkers and one hut. Camp was approximately 1-2 months old and had appearance of periodic but not permanent use. Items of clothing, waterproofing, and grenades were found in the hut.

12 April 1967. At 121000 coordinates (916496) Company Lima 3d platoon found an enemy base camp. Camp consisted of one hut and five small holes. Area thoroughly checked w/neg results. Area destroyed. Patrol continued mission.

At 121153 coordinates (927496) Company Lima 2nd platoon discovered tunnel. Also found 1 AK47 and a barrel of 7.62 size M.G. Area being checked for further network and equipment.

At 121200 coordinates (924493) Company Lima had one MedEvac completed. Severely sprained right ankle. MedEvac number B-7426. Non-battle.

At 121150 coordinates (919504) Company India had one priority MedEvac completed. MedEvac number S-1945. Severe pain in chest. Non-battle.

13 April 1967. At 130810 coordinates (931483) Company Lima found four graves w/markers dated October 1966. Graves dug deep and all had markers.

At 130930 coordinates (975448) Company Kilo found Chicom rigged as mine near trail. Mine appeared to be several weeks old. Mine had trip wires attached. Company Kilo continued mission.

At 131130 coordinates (949469) Company Lima made contact with two enemy on trail. At 131145 Company Lima exchanged small arms fire with the enemy. Artillery mission fired into area. Company Lima checking out area.

At 131000 coordinates (926449) Company Kilo found one bow and arrow type booby trap activated by trip wires were rigged with two arrows approximately nine inches long. Appeared to be one week old. While checking area Company Kilo found another mine similar to the one previously reported. 50 meters from trail. Mine destroyed.

At 131530 coordinates (972449) Company Kilo found two more Chicom grenades rigged as mines. Mines removed and buried.

At 131615 coordinates (972450) after Company Kilo and Company Lima made link-up, one Marine tripped a Chicom rigged as mine causing five KIA. Four from Kilo and one from Lima. MedEvac moved to Route 9.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

15 April 1967. At 152215H coordinates (977434) a Marine was badly mauled by a wild animal of some type. Marine has been returned to Co. "L" CP and is now being moved to 3/3 CP for additional medical attention. Check fire on all artillery and H&I's has been effected to insure safe movement on road. Bn. Surgeon alerted to treat patient on arrival this position.

16 April 1967. At 161110 at 3d Battalion, 3d Marines CP the badly mauled Marine from Co. "L" 1st platoon was brought to 3d Battalion, 3d Marines CP where he was examined by the Battalion Surgeon. Marine will be kept at 3d Battalion, 3d Marines BAS. A priority MedEvac will be requested at first light. Animal that mauled Marine was not killed, but after debriefing squad leaders the animal was of considerable size and moved with great stealth. The wound on the Marine's right arm also proved the wild animal was large in size.

At 160020 at (975556) M&S observed two explosions. A check of all H&I's were made and none were fired from 3d Battalion, 3d Marines or Co. "M" positions. All 3d Battalion, 3d Marines units on alert.

At 160155 at (982567) Company "M" received three incoming mortar from a suspected enemy mortar position. At 161200 artillery and 81mm mortar missions were called into suspected areas.

17 April 1967. At 170800H at 3d Battalion, 3d Marines CP Co. "I" and Co. "M" began the change of positions. At 171000H at (974566) Co. "I" assumed DPON of Co. "M"'s position. Co. "M" is now located at 3d Battalion, 3d Marines CP.

LE 14 April 1967 No Significant Events.

15 April 1967 No Significant Events.

12 April 1967 At 191000H at (966574) a patrol on the back made contact with one NVA/VC. An exchange of S/A fire was made, NVA/VC broke contact and fled North-east.

At 191015H at (996567) Co. "K" 1st platoon made contact with one NVA/VC wearing green uniform and weapon. He had no hand or peak. Patrol delivered S/A fire into the area. Enemy broke contact and fled north.

At 191635H information has been received at 2/3 Co. that in the villages in the upper Ba Long Valley area there will be villagers sleeping in the fields at night with their crops. GS (0245)(0245)(0245)(0245)(0245). The purpose of this is to prevent wild animals from attacking them prior to daylight.

It is requested that the villagers be instructed that if they stay in their fields at night that their safety cannot be guaranteed. They must be in their villages by dark.

20 April 1967 No Significant Events.

21 April 1967 At 090000H (977434) Co. "J" 1st platoon and 2nd platoon departed present position to carry out mission assigned at 3d Battalion, 3d Marines. Reg. Order 19-01.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

22 April 1967. No Significant Events.

23 April 1967. At 221145H at (967568) a patrol from Co. "I" found a cave. Main entrance spiral and drops off to 20 feet. Concealed but accessible. Artillery or 60mm would have trouble penetrating defense of caves.

At 231542H Co. "M" lost visual contact with fifteen suspected NVA's. Visibility was severely restricted by rain. Co. "M" intends on moving a short distance to the north and conduct search and destroy mission to the east into GS (8851). Artillery mission was called into area with excellent target coverage.

At 240840H at coordinates (990515) helicopters reported to 3d Battalion, 3d Marines that they were receiving small arms tracer fire. Helicopters received no hits. Artillery mission called 400X400 sweeping zone on above coordinates.

24 April 1967. At 240840 coordinates (990515) helicopters reported to 3d Battalion, 3d Marines that they received small arms fire. Helicopters received no hits and an artillery mission was called 400X400 sweeping zone. Excellent target coverage. Results unknown.

At 240945 coordinates (883517) Co. "M" found several rein shelters. Appeared to have been abandoned for approximately 6 months. Area contains well used trails.

At 241100 Co. "M" located a half acre area that has been used as a log cutting area within the past month. Area being searched for possible bunkers.

25 April 1967. (940427) engineer unit ambushed by mortars and grenades. 4 vehicles were in column when incident occurred. 2 vehicles were knocked out, one brought back 4 NVA's to Co. "I" where MedEvac was completed. Co. "I" sent to assist. Result of action was 21 NVA's and 5 KIA's.

At 251000 at Co. "M" a Marine from Co. "M" was injured accidentally when a grenade exploded in his bunker. MedEvac received at 1110, completed at 1140.

At 251000 at (991514) helicopters reported receiving small arms fire, 50 caliber, 8 artillery rounds and 10-80mm rounds fired.

At 251045 at (991497) while enroute to Co. "M" position, engineers with one P1 and one jeep were hit by small arms fire and what appeared to be a rocket missile. Location of the action was 1000 meters west of the NVA position. 7-62 caliber small arms fire and 10-80mm rounds were fired on top of hitting the NVA. The P1 also was hit by 10-80mm rounds. All injured vehicles at NVA position within 1000 meters of the action were 5 USMC KIA's and 23 NVA's KIA's.

2.0 SUMMARY

At 2508GZ (948189) engineer unit was ambushed by enemy in concealed positions north of Route 9 along the bend. First vehicle, a dump truck with trailer, was mined. Right front tire was blown and the truck went out of control. Simultaneously it was hit by about ten 72mm 2.7. mortars. The 4mm in support, 200 meters behind started moving up to the ambush site, when approximately 25 meters from the site, it received heavy automatic small arms fire, mortars and grenades. Enemy from north side of road threw approximately one gallon size can filled with explosives which knocked out 40mm. All the personnel moved to south side of the road and set defensive positions immediately after the initial contact. At approximately the same time engineer sweep team in FC were proceeding south along road 09 (9287) when vehicle hit mine resulting in total damage of same. Squad was sent from Lima's position in assistance with 40mm. Two 4 mm's were sent from this Co to Co. "L" position reinforced with two squads and proceeded south. Link-up effected made with engineers at 251200. All casualties were collected and returned to Co. "L" position for MedEvac. All personnel were back at Co. "L" position by 1600. MedEvac was completed at 1515. Result of action was 5 USMC KIA's and 23 USMC MIA's.

26 Apr 1967. No Significant Events.

27 Apr 1967. At 240000H at coordinates (991444) an engineer sweep team found that the bridge at checkpoint 24 had been blown during the night.

At 270350H at coordinates (981515) one VC with black top and khaki shorts threw grenades at convoy going north at above coordinates. Small arms fire and grenades were thrown in return.

At 270815H at 3/3 CT, Ca Lu outpost forwarded to 5/3 this position one suspected NVN U.S./Deserter. Name: Nguyen Huu Phuong. Rank: EM, Unit: 103 Combat Company, Tho Sahn. Subject was forwarded to 15th JIF Cam Lo for disposition.

At 270730H Company "E" at coordinates (950566) spotted one NVA/VC dressed in khaki clothes chopping a tree. Three shots from Ontos were fired into the area.

At 270800H at coordinates (947533) the OP on the Ramroak spotted man made light. Artillery mission was called into the area with excellent target coverage.

28 Apr 1967. At 201435H at coordinates (980442) engineers were repairing the bridge with a security squad from Company "L" when one sniper round came into the area striking the forehead of one of the engineers. The area was swept with small arms fire and a 4.2 mortar mission was called with excellent target coverage.

At 281800H at coordinates (994516) a patrol from Company "K" found ten to twelve lean-to type shelters for two men each constructed of bamboo. There were also found some fighting holes 3'x3'x2'. The position provided excellent observation of 3/3 or Camp Carroll. The area had not been used for about a week or two. The lean-to's were destroyed.

At 29 April 1967 at coordinates (993515) Company Kilo 2nd Platoon found several trails running off the ridge line toward the villages to the north and south. The trails were in good condition and appeared to have been used in the two or three days prior. The patrol also found at coordinates (995515) four lean-to's made of bamboo. They appeared to be about one week old. The patrol destroyed same and continued mission.

At 290925H at coordinates (965571) Company "L" 3rd platoon found one 82mm mortar round, three casings of empty 60mm rounds and three 82mm mortar round casings. Round and casings were destroyed and the patrol continued on its mission.

At 291000H at coordinates (997516) Company "K" 2nd platoon found an OP type perimeter in area where observation of Camp Carroll could be easily obtained as well as 3/3 and 3/3. Twenty-four lean-to type shelters and twenty-six fighting holes were also found in the area. Items found laying around the area were: Philippine beer bottle, Vietnamese and American cigarets, packs, knives, and spoons, articles made out of gabbag material, a large sack that could have contained up to one hundred pounds of rice. There were depressions in ground that could have been mortar pits. The camp area was about as usual. The patrol destroyed lean-to's and thoroughly checked the area.

At 291551H at coordinates (026481) Company "L" 1st platoon while moving to an assigned defensive position along the base of a cliff when a rock fell on a man resulting in a fractured skull. The medical for the man was completed at 291715H at coordinates (0149).

At 291800H at coordinates (906511) Company "E" 2nd platoon found an old bunker with 10-15 lean-to type shelters. The area consisted of several lean-to type shelters and fighting holes 3'x3'x2' positioned in a line. The patrol destroyed shelters and continued on mission.

At 291800H at coordinates (016511) Company "E" 2nd platoon found a large type lean-to shelter and fighting holes. The area consisted of forty-five two-man lean-to's, twenty-four two-man fighting holes, and ten two-man fighting holes 4'x3'x2'. Also at coordinates (016211) the patrol found thirty-five two-man type shelters and thirty-five fighting holes 3'x3'x2' spaced out over a small area. Trails were running in a north-south direction and had not been used for over a month. The patrol destroyed the shelters and fighting holes in their mission.

At 291000H at coordinates (997516) Company "K" 2nd platoon found an OP type perimeter in area where observation of Camp Carroll could be easily obtained as well as CaLu and 3/3 CP. Twenty-four lean-to type shelters and twenty-six fighting holes were also found in the area. Items found laying around the area were: Philipino beer bottle, Vietnamese and American cigarette pack, Vietnamese spoon, skivies made out of sandbag material, a large sack that could have contained up to one-hundred pounds of rice. There were depressions around that might have been mortar pits. The camp area was about one month old. The patrol destroyed lean-to's and thoroughly checked the area.

At 291545H at coordinates (0026491) Company "L" 1st platoon while moving to assigned objective was moving along the base of a cliff when a rock fell on a man resulting in a sprained ankle. The medevac for the man was completed at 291745H at coordinates (014491).

At 291830H at coordinates (996515) Company "K" 2nd platoon found an old harbor site which appeared to be several weeks old. Site consisted of several lean-to type shelters and eighteen fighting holes 3'x3'x3' positioned in a perimeter. The patrol destroyed shelters and continued on mission.

30 April 1967 At 301000H at coordinates (816511) Company "K" 2nd platoon found a large camp area which appeared over 1 month old and consisted of forty-five two-man shelters, 25 one man fighting holes 3'x3'x3' and ten two man fighting holes 4'x3'x3'. Also at coordinates (061501) the same patrol found thirty-five two-man lean-to type shelters and thirty-five fighting holes 3'x3'x3'? and approximately one month old. Trails were running in an area E-W direction and had not been used for over a month. The patrol destroyed the shelters and continued their mission.

S-3 CHRONOLOGY

At 301830H at coordinates (991534) members of 3/3 spotted NVA/VC wearing dark clothing moving on the ridge line. NVA/VC were partially concealed and it could not be determined if they were carrying weapons or packs. An 81mm mortar mission was called and a 40mm mission was fired on the ridge line with excellent target coverage.

At 302250H at coordinates (987538) two small secondary explosions were reported as a result of night H&I fires.

At 302306H at coordinates (013507) a chopper moving south was observed to have received approximately fifteen rounds of machine gun fire. An estimated six rounds of return fire was also reported.

At 302300H it was reported that on 27 April at 1600H at coordinates (930576) a special forces agent reported seeing one VC company with Vietnamese civilians. The company had 12 VC WIA's and 9 U.S. POW's. Eight were handcuffed and one only had one arm. Weapons reported were: two BAR's, one AK-47, one 61mm, twenty-five carbines and 30 caliber rifles. Quang Tri rucks P/3, special forces rucks P/6.



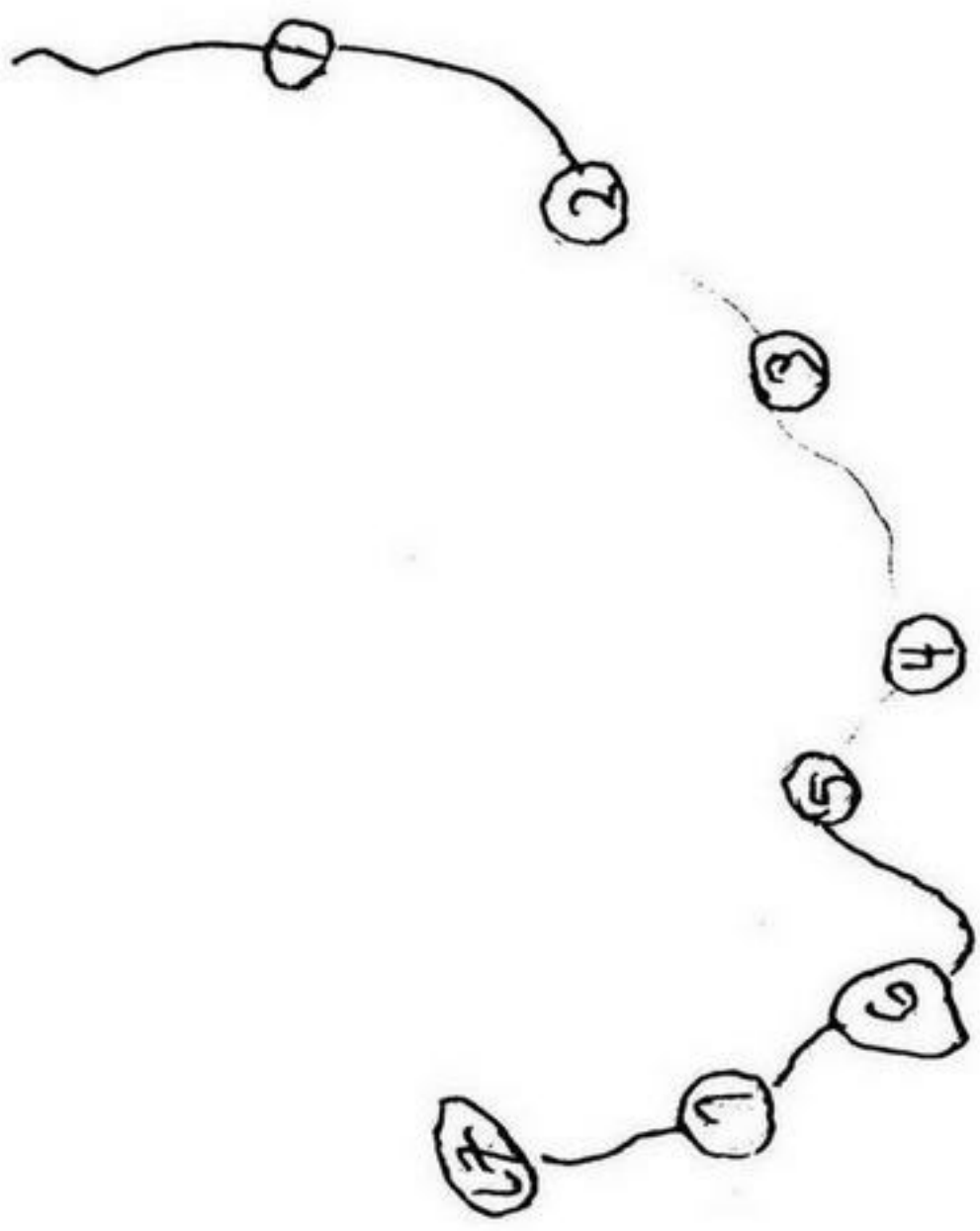

Artillery support for the operation was exceptionally good. All the areas fired into were thoroughly searched.

1st MAW provided helicopters for troop lift and MedEvac requested.

- 11 April 1300H The tactical troop lift for the Command Group "A". Companies "I", "K", and "L" commenced.
 1505H A priority MedEvac was requested by Co. "L".
 1525H The troop lift was completed. The above MedEvac was completed.
 1600H Another priority MedEvac was requested by Co. "L".
 1623H The MedEvac was completed for Co. "L".
- 12 April 0800H A priority MedEvac was requested by Co. "I".
 1100H A request for a tactical troop lift for Companies "K" and "L".
 1145H The MedEvac was completed.
 1630H The troop lift for the above request commenced.
 1730H The troop lift was completed for Co. "K" only. Co. "I" was not lifted because of inclement weather.
- 13 April, No air request was submitted.

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6. Intelligence. The following enemy intelligence was available prior to commencing the mission. During the latter part of January 1967 and early February 1967, an enemy base camp was located in the vicinity of XD 965452. Enemy units consisting of NVA and VC in strengths up to twenty-five personnel were observed and contact made with along a trail in the vicinity of this base camp. The enemy mission appeared to be infiltration or resupply along this trail, utilizing the base camp as a way station. In mid February 1967 a large, well constructed and equipped base camp complex was located in the vicinity of XD 905497. Also minor sightings and contacts with small NVA/VC units in the surrounding area. It was speculated that the enemy mission in this vicinity was also infiltration, possibly utilizing the base camp complex as a rest and reorganization station. Intelligence of a more timely nature was a sighting and contact, made with an enemy force estimated at 80 NVA immediately north of Hill 492, XD 924489, during the morning of 10 April 1967. The mission of this enemy unit is unknown, however, it was noted that although greatly superior in strength to the friendly unit, the enemy did not attack aggressively, but limited their deployment to light probes. Overall, it was anticipated that the enemy situation throughout the area of operation consisted of a limited number of guide/liason personnel with the possibility of larger units infiltrating through.

During the conduct of the mission, enemy contact consisted of one small arms engagement with 2 NVA/VC at XD 949469 resulting in 2 enemy KIA (prob), and the location of 4 enemy emplaced mines 2 booby traps. The mines were of Chicom grenade type, activated by trip wire. The booby traps were bow and arrow types with seven foot long spears activated by trip wires, both located at XD 972449. The enemy emplacements located during the mission were 15 camouflaged bunkers and 1 hut at XD 927469 and a platoon size base camp at XD 916496. Also discovered were 2 graves estimated to be two months old at XD 927469 and 4 graves with markers dated October 1966 at XD 931483.

The terrain within the area of operation is mountainous jungle with vegetation ranging from waist high elephant grass to a double canopy, in excess of seventy feet. Due to the nature of the terrain and denseness of the foliage cover and concealment is excellent. The same aspects of terrain and vegetation that enhance cover and concealment, however, tend to limit observation. Although there are no obstacles in the area of operation, the ruggedness of the terrain and thickness of vegetation hamper rapid foot movement unless existing trails are utilized. Critical terrain features are Hill 492 at XD 925498, Dong Ca Lu at XD 933476, Hill 512 at XD 954451, and the finger overlooking the Khe Ba Ngao at XD 980445. Avenues of approach to the area of operation are the Tien Hien Valley at XD 915543 and the Gieng Thuan Valley at XD 915525 in the north. The plateau through which the Khe Ngal and Khe One flow at XD 895472 in the west, the Rio Quan Valley at XD 925419 in the south-east and east.

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The weather experienced during the mission varied from clear and sunny during the early stages, to overcast and rainy in the latter.

Civil Affairs activities and psychological warfare operations were not conducted during the mission. The only civilian hamlet located in the vicinity of the area of operation is the Montagnard hamlet of Tan An located south of the Riviere De Quang Tri. There is no recent evidence of enemy activity in this hamlet. All indications are that the populace of this hamlet are friendly and cooperative.

7. Mission. 3d Battalion, 3d Marines conduct a two phase search and destroy operation in an area indicated on Annex A (Operation Overlay). Special emphasis will be placed on a search and destroy operation within GS. XD 9149 and XD 9249. The main North-South trail network in the area will be checked out for enemy movement, all terrain features such as fences and draws will be checked for way-stations, harbor sites, food caches, and weapons caches.

B. Concept of Operation.

a. Phase I.

(1) At H-Hour, on D-day one Rifle Company (Rein) will be helilifted from En CP to LZ vicinity of coordinates XD 924498; conduct a search and destroy operation on Hill 492 and establish a blocking position running generally east and west on the north slope of Hill 492.

(2) At H+1 one Rifle Company (Rein) will be helilifted from En CP to LZ vicinity of coordinates XD 915522; conduct a search and destroy mission generally to S3 through GS 9151 and 9150; effect link up with blocking force on Hill 492.

(3) At H+2 one Rifle Company (-) will be helilifted from Co Lu coordinates XD 912455 to LZ vicinity coordinates XD 934525; conduct a search and destroy mission generally to the south-southwest through GS 9351 and 9250. effect a link-up with blocking force on Hill 492.

b. Phase II.

(1) Co Aider one Rifle Company (-) will be helilifted from Hill 492 to Co Lu coordinates XD 912455 and move by foot to position coordinates XD 903437 (trail juncture with Route 9); move north on trail and establish a blocking position from coordinates XD 962451 to coordinates XD 970451 facing north.

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(2) On order one Rifle Company (Rain) will be helilifted from Hill 492 to Hill 715 vicinity coordinates XD 942476; establish a blocking position from coordinates XD 937475 to XD 943477 facing north.

(3) On order one Rifle Company (Rain) will conduct a search and destroy operation generally to the southwest utilizing main North-South trail network; upon link-up with blocking force located Hill 715 and on order both companies will search and destroy to the southwest along trail and effect link-up with blocking force located vicinity coordinates XD 965452.

(4) Upon link-up all companies will search and destroy to Route 9 vicinity coordinates XD 983437 and move to Ca Lu.

(5) All units will be moved via truck from Ca Lu to Bn CP.

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9. Discussion.

On 11 April at 1330H, the helilift of Command Group Alpha, Company "I" and Company "L" commenced. This portion of the helilift was completed at 111430H with the Command Group and Company "L" being landed in the vicinity of XD 931489 and Company "I" at XD 915522. Commencing at 111500H, Company "K" (-) was helilifted from CaLu to vicinity of XD 925525. The lift was completed at 111530H.

Company "I" moved from their HLZ to the vicinity of XD 919503 where they set up night defensive positions. Company "L" in the advance of the Command Group "A", while moving to XD 928495 and at 111500H found a base camp consisting of 25 bunkers and one hut with an appearance of periodic but not permanent use. Items found in the area were clothing, waterproofing, grenade holders, 3 empty rucksacks and 2 graves approximately 1 - 2 months old. Movement was continued after a thorough search of the area. Night defensive positions were prepared and occupied at XD 925499 by the Command Group and Company "L". Company "K"(-) after insertion moved in basically a southern direction to XD 937513 where a perimeter defense was set up in thick undergrowth. No evidence of trails or enemy movement was noted during the advance.

At 120730H, Company "K" commenced moving to vicinity XD 933509. At 121000H, the 3d Platoon, Company "K", found a small enemy basecamp at XD 916596. The camp consisted of 1 hut and 5 small fighting holes. No equipment was found. The camp was destroyed.

At 121030H Company "K" arrived at XD 933509 and the 3d Platoon was given the mission of moving down into the valley and sweeping to the southwest linking back up with the company at XD 926503. At 121000H 2d Platoon, Company "K", located an enemy base camp at XD 927496. A thorough search revealed 31 fighting holes approximately 3'x3'x5', 16 log bunkers 5'x7'x7', 1 log bunker 8'x10'x12' which was incomplete and contained a small amount of medical items, 5 huts 6'x6'x10', 1 underground cooking hut, 1 can of 100 rounds of linked 7.62 ammunition, 1 machinegun barrel, 1 AK-47, entrenching equipment, a small amount of 782 gear, 4 graves approximately 6 months old, one tunnel 30-50 feet long and 1 mine which was buried but not rigged for use. The camp was destroyed utilizing demolitions and entrenching tools.

During the morning hours of 12 April, Company "I" conducted a search ~~mission~~ mission in GS 9150 with negative results.

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Company "K", after detaching the 3d Platoon, moved along the high ground to the southwest reaching the predetermined link-up point at 121230H. At 121500H the 3d Platoon of Company "K" was directed to move to XD 930492. At 121500H Company "I" moved to vicinity of XD 925496 ~~arriving~~ at 121600H in preparation for a helilift. The Company "I" lift was cancelled due to inelement weather. The Company "K" lift commenced at 121700H moving it from two LZ's at XD 930492 and XD 926503 to Ca Lu at YD C12455. The helilift was completed at 121800H. At 121730H Companies "L" and "I" and the Command Group moved to the vicinity of XD 929490 arriving at 122000H and establishing their night defensive positions. Company "K" moved to XD 983439 at Ca Lu and established its night defensive position at 122000H.

At 130700H Company "L" departed its night defensive position followed by the Command Group with Company "I" in trace. At 130730H Company "K" departed its night position moving along a trail to the north toward a blocking position. At 130910H in the vicinity of XD 978447 the point man of Company "K" located two Chicom grenades and a cross-bow rigged to drive two 7-foot stakes across the trail. All the devices were of the trip type and were rigged approximately 50 meters apart. Movement was continued on the trail until arrival at XD 971450 at approximately 131130H when three Chicom grenades were found similarly rigged. All the mines were dismantled and buried. The blocking position was established with one platoon along the trail and the stream leading to the east. An outlying security was established and a squad-size reconnaissance patrol was sent east along the stream with negative results. As Company "K" moved north to their blocking position, Companies "L" and "I" with the Command Group moved in a southerly direction along the trail indicated in the overlay. The trail had been well marked and prepared. There were bomb shelters dug approximately 50 meters apart. Different portions of the trail were made more negotiable by handrails, steps and bridges. Small base camps appeared generally along those portions of the trail nearest the water where there are thick canopy and steep rocky draws affording much natural cover and concealment from artillery and air. At 131210H the Company "L" point man was moving down the trail in the vicinity of XD 949469 where there is a stream crossing. As the pointman entered the stream, two NVA on the opposite bank arose from concealed positions and fired killing the pointman. The man behind the point fired as the NVA were fleeing and wounded one. An artillery mission was fired south and east along the trail with excellent target coverage. A search of the immediate area showed heavy blood trails and pools of blood off the trail. Company "L" claimed two NVA killed (prob).

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Company "L" ~~continued in a southerly~~ direction along the trail, establishing communications with Company "K" blocking force at 131515H. At 131750H the lead element of Company "L" arrived at the blocking position and continued to move through Company "K". At 131810H a member of Company "L" activated a mine attached to a vine hand-rail resulting in six casualties. All wounds were minor and treated on the spot. Company "L" continued south reaching Route 9 in the vicinity of XB 983438 at 131930H.

Upon arrival at the road, the KIA and WIA's were all MedEvaced by vehicle. All units moved east and north along Route 9. Company "K" arrived at Ca Lu at 132250H. The last elements of Company "I" following in trace of Company "L" and Command Group "A" arrived at the Battalion CP at 140230H, concluding the operation.

b. No maintenance problems were encountered.


c. Treatment of all casualties was done on the spot.
