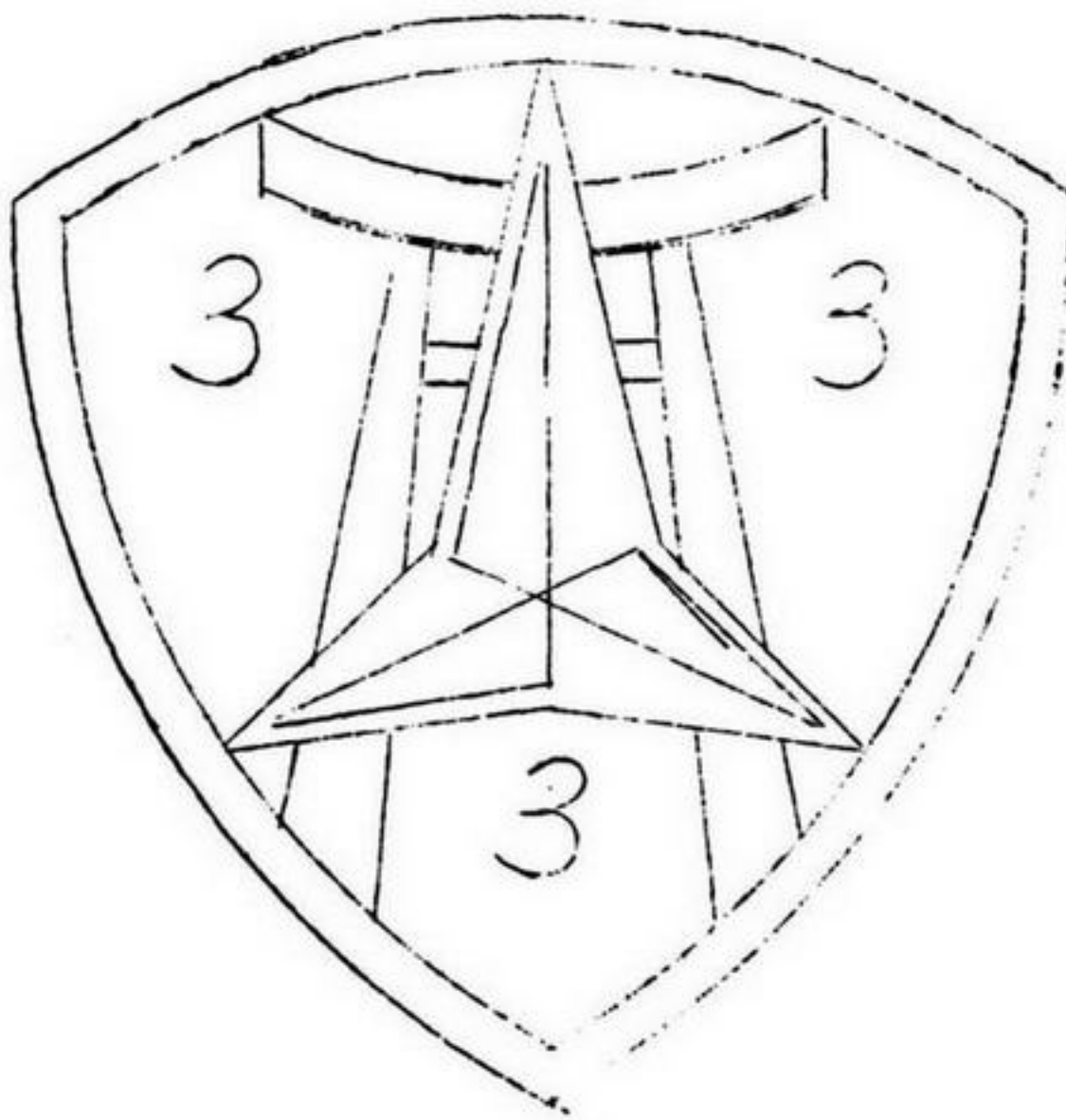

PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of November, the change of AO brought a new type of enemy activity. Enemy-initiated activity consisted primarily of attacks by fire, mining of the MSR, and hasty ambushes of opportunity along the MSR. The Battalion has patrolled the AO and made significant ground contact once. It is evident that the enemy in our AO is VC-oriented and is definitely not willing to or capable of meeting us on the ground.

The western portion of the AO was covered by aggressive patrolling. Control of the eastern portion was hampered by VC mining and ambushing of the MSR. The Battalion conceived a counter-ambush plan and has not been ambushed since. Night ambushes were increased to counteract the mining of the MSR.

The Battalion reported numerous signs of activity in the DMZ, consisting of lights at night and sightings and contacts made by Recon teams.

Concept of Operation in the DMZ.

1. On 25 Nov 68 to insert 2 Recon teams in the DMZ to seize prisoners.
2. To be prepared to commit a Sparrow Hawk from Recon Lt OPCB for extraction of Recon teams if required.
3. To be prepared to commit a Bald Eagle followed by a Bn (-) if needed.

29 November 1968

1. On 29 Nov, Recon team Hungarian will move by A/C with C/1/61 (rein) with plt, 1/3 Tks from A-4 and enter DMZ in the area UG1277 and IR1574. C/1/61 will be prepared to support Recon team by fire.
2. On 30 Nov, Recon team Salinas will move by foot with L/3/3 from A-4 and enter the DMZ in the area UL0773 and LR0971. L/3/3 will be prepared to support team by fire.
3. Neither company will enter the DMZ, however, L/3/3 will remain just south of the DMZ in area where insert occurs while C(-)/1/61(rein) returns to A-4.
4. There will be a plt of G/2/3, with a capability to observe and control air and artillery, located at OPCB that may be employed as Sparrow Hawk upon order CO 3/3.
5. If required to execute a Bald Eagle with L/3/3 or C/1/61, immediately 3/3 (-) will close and move on order from A-4 to the assistance.

1040H In the area of YD1146615, the OP at C-11 observed 4 NVA's entering Co I's 3d platoon position. They were in uniform and 2 had ID cards. They were apprehended and turned over to 2d Battalion, 3d Marines.

1425H In the area of YD115724, elements of C/1/61 were moving north when a directional type Chicom Claymore was tripped.

1500H In the area of YD102693, a flame tank of Co 1, 3d Tanks hit a very deeply buried metal mine. The tank was the fourth one to pass over the mine.

30 Nov 68 1755H In the area of YD104666, elements of Co F spotted 6 indigenous personnel north of their position. They seemed to be picking up or putting something down. Fired 60mm, 81mm mortar and artillery. Results unknown.

7. EQUIPMENT

As of 30 November, 87.5% of the combat essential equipment was combat operational. (FORSTAT Report of 30 Nov 68)

(2) Class V

- (a) The Battalion had no problems in the resupply of Class V. Although the Quang Tri ACP was out of 81mm FP rounds for 4 days, the Battalion had an adequate reserve and there was no adverse effect on the Battalion's combat capabilities. The Class V problem which faced the Battalion during the period was the turn-in of ammunition left behind by units previously occupying A-4, C-2, and C-3. This included both grade III and good ammunition. Approximately 150 tons of ammunition were taken from the above mentioned positions to the ACP's at Dong Ha and Quang Tri.

(3) Resupply

- (a) During the month of November, the Battalion was supplied exclusively by ground transportation. Five 2 1/2 ton 6x6 trucks from 3d MT Bn were to be allotted to the Battalion for this purpose. Due to mechanical difficulties and other commitments, the average number of trucks working for the Battalion was 3. The Battalion was also supported by 2 stake bed trailers from 9th MT Bn once a week.

(4) Evacuation and Hospitalization

- (a) No problems in this area during the month.

(5) Transportation

- (a) Total mileage on organic vehicles during the reporting period was 7660 miles.

(6) Service

- (a) A platoon of Co B, 3d Engineer Bn rendered assistance in all engineering tasks, but heavy equipment was unobtainable.
- (b) During the reporting period, the Battalion was supported by a USF team from 3d SF Bn.

- a. No battalion awards ceremonies were held during the month.
- b. A total of 2 Court Martials were held during November; 2 FCM. 8 Court Martials are pending. 5 Battalion Commanders Office Hours were completed and 12 are pending. There were 8 Company Commanders Office Hours completed and 19 are pending.
- c. Post Exchange services were not available, however sundry packages were distributed.
- d. Liberty was not authorized during this period.

- e. The R&R program continues to be a major morale factor within the battalion. There were 72 out of country R&R quotas and 29 in country R&R quotas used during this month.
- f. Morale is considered excellent to outstanding.
- g. Postal services during the month have been good.

12. INTELLIGENCE

On 1 Nov the Bn moved from Camp Carroll to Con Thien with half of the Bn at C-2. The month of Nov encountered several contacts with the enemy. The size of the enemy during the contact varied from fire team to squad size. On 3 Nov 2130H K/3/3 LP spotted 4 personnel north east on hill 561 in vic YD132665. Throw frag grenades and fired M-79. Pulled in LP. Unknown results. At 101130H M/3/3 observed 4 NVA vic YD057656. Took enemy under fire with small arms. Searched area and found old bunker complex vic YD058654. Results of contact were negative. At 111550H M/3/3 had contact with approx 15 NVA with small arms and automatic weapons vic YD082638. Arty MSR was called. Results were unknown. At 201100H K/3/3 spotted 2 enemy vic YD114626. Fired on enemy with small arms killing 1. ID card on the body stated that the enemy was from the 1st Company, 3d Battalion, 20th NVA (IUD) Regiment. On 251920H L/3/3 spotted 6-8 enemy moving north on the road vic YD115697. Called artillery and fired 60mm mortars with unknown results. On 261130H K/3/3 spotted 4-5 enemy wearing brown camouflaged utilities vic YD089642. Fired on enemy and enemy returned fire with negative results.

The Bn had several mine incidents during the month of Nov. On 070912H L/3/3 walked into a mine field vic YD132617. Also at 070930H detonated anti-tank mine which was rigged as anti-personnel mine on the road. Called mine sweeper for road vic YD132617. Negative results. There was a notable increase in 122mm rocket, 82mm mortar, and 60mm mortar during the month. Incident on 101030H the Bn received 16 rounds incoming estimated 75mm Recoilless Rifle fire from vic YD165705, YD063702, and YD080675. Arty could not be called because of air traffic. On 101330H 3/3 received 18 rounds of 122mm rockets from vic YD035695, YD033679, YD080700, and YD063702. On 161125H 3/3 at C-2 received 20 rounds incoming 60mm and 82mm mortars from vic YD103669. The enemy also ambushed the MSR several times. On 081245H K/3/3 observed truck receiving 2 rounds small arms fire from vic YD133638. At 161345H 3/3 vehicles received approx 15 rounds of sniper fire from east of road vic YD137620. At 171030H 3/3 vehicle enroute from south to Con Thien vic YD133632 was ambushed. On 181725H I/3/3 truck vic YD132628 was ambushed from both sides of road, receiving 30-50 rounds of 30cal fire and 3 RPG rounds. Called arty and gunships. Area was checked with negative results. On 191445H I/3/3 vehicles were taken under fire by SA and RPG and hand grenades vic YD133624 to YD127622. 75-150 rounds of SA and RPG and UCK number of grenades. Spotted 5-8 enemy west of road. Arty MSR was called and fire was returned with 3AP and 50cal.

Numerous bunkers were found during Nov. At 191645H K/3/3 found camp area recently occupied by large unit vic YD086656. Also fresh trails and 30 fighting holes. There was also fresh blood and bandages in area. On 261020H K/3/3 found 2 old bunkers at least 6 mo old in vic YD088634. Also 20 meters north K/3/3 found elaborate system of trenches in a zig-zag fashion. Approx 25 meters up trail vic YD088634 found numerous name plates with the following information:

QUACH VAN PHU W3-19
 NGUYEN BA LINH W3-74
 TRAN VAN NU W3-73
 TRAN HUY CU W3-71

W3 on the plates is an AKA for the 64th Regiment, 320th NVA Division. Many lights were observed by the Bn's OP's. Vic YD172820, YD172807, YD142798, and YD125799. The month of Nov again indicated the enemy's desire to build up and occupy positions in the 3d Marines AO. The sighting of lights within the DMZ indicates that the enemy are taking advantage of the present bombing halt by utilizing the DMZ.

13. COMMUNICATIONS

a. Significant Events

The forward command post was moved from Camp Carroll to A-4 and C-2. Communication assets were divided between each CP. Electrical power was nonexistent at both positions and an engineer team was dispatched to install permanent exterior electrical wiring. Two generators were obtained. A 20kw for C-2 and a 30kw for A-4. Project 972 equipment was used to support communication assets at A-4. 3d Mar assigned a TRC-27 radio relay team to A-4 for

land-line communications between C-4 and Camp Carroll. Radio Relay could not be obtained for C-2.

b. Problem Areas

- (1) Handsets for GPRC-25 are in very short supply.
- (2) Telephones T-1/PT are still on requisition and needed to support the rifle companies wire systems.

JOURNAL SUMMARY

- 01 Nov 68 No significant events.
- 02 Nov 68 1620H In the area of YD165715, elements of Co A, 3d Tank Bn observed 7 indigenous personnel moving northeast then changing to an eastern direction. The personnel appeared to be carrying 1 body.
- 1700H In the area of YD165715, elements of Co M observed 7 civilians carrying loads of straw and 1 body. The personnel entered a tree line and returned a few minutes later without their loads. The civilians returned to a village area to the east. 1 plt reinforced with a tank plt attempted to intercept, but were unable to.
- 03 Nov 68 2100H In the area of YD132665, elements of Co K spotted 4 enemy personnel and threw 9 M-26 frags, fired 2 M-79 rounds, and pulled in the LP, and fired 20 60mm M2 rounds and 10 illumination 81mm rounds and 18 81mm M2 rounds. The personnel were moving north by northeast. Negative results.
- 04 Nov 68 No significant events.
- 05 Nov 68 No significant events.
- 06 Nov 68 No significant events.
- 07 Nov 68 0930H In the area of YD132617, elements of Co I while crossing a trail stepped on an AT mine rigged as an CP mine. The result was 2 KIA, 4 WIA. The area was swept with mine detectors. Negative results.
- 1000H In the area of YD132617, engineers used mine detectors to sweep the area and found mine indicators. Description: triangular shape. The marker was made of bamboo and pointing to the detonation area.
- 1025 H In the area of YD132617, Co L began to receive incoming of approximately 15 rounds of 122mm rockets. An AO was employed and artillery fired on suspected rocket positions YD053665 and YD052675 with unknown results.
- 1130H In the area of YD159610, 2 indigenous personnel reported that 2 VC had placed mines in the road. The civilians were paid not less than 500, not more than 1000 Piasters by 3-2.
- 1215H In the area of YD159610, the 2d Provisional Btry received 1 round of 122mm rocket which hit a powder bunker and in turn set fire to the fuse and projectile bunker. Also, a 5 ton truck was destroyed.
- 1330H In the area of YD135645, Co L began to leave C-2 on tanks and began to receive incoming of 122mm rockets. Artillery

missions were called on suspected launchers. FO at C-2 observed 9 positive and up to 14 possible secondary explosions from artillery fire.

1330H In the area of YD159610, Co E received 10 rounds of 122mm rockets inside their perimeter.

08 Nov 68 0855H In the area of YD155610, elements of Co I received 1 incoming round of small arms fire. The round came from the west and passed over the heads of the patrol. The patrol checked out the area with negative results.

1245H In the area of YD133638, elements of Co K observed a truck receiving approximately 30 rounds of small arms automatic fire from the west side of the road. Co K and I sent out patrols with negative results.

09 Nov 68 1300H In the area of YD125694, elements of Co M observed 35 VC suspects, that were cutting stalks and other vegetation, moving east. A second group, in the area of YD125690, was moving north when apprehended by Co , 3d Tank Bn. Claimed to be from Gio Linh and were going to Phu Phuong to get tea. The first group was apprehended by a squad from Co M for a total of 71 detainees. The detainees were turned over to Regt S-2.

1500H In the area of YD118694, elements of Co M discovered the following US ordnance in a pile. 6 M-26 frags, 12 M-79 rounds, 800 M-16 rounds, 300 7.62 rounds, and 2 L.A.'s. All ordnance returned to Con Thien

10 Nov 68 1115H In the area of YD118686, elements of Co C, 1st Bn, 3d Marines with engineers on road sweep discovered 2 homemade M mines approximately 20lb each. They were pressure type. The mines were 75yd apart on the road, one to the right center and one to the left center. The mines were made of a Chicom grenade and TNT wrapped in plastic tied with string. The mines were buried about 2in deep. The firing devices were covered with cardboard, then dirt. Markers consisted of green U2 canteens (2), open and toward center line and a mouse trap broken up and laying in a triangular pattern. The firing devices were wrapped in green tape. The top of the device resembled a MU-5, but it was a homemade device. There were 3 of them in the mine, extended about 1in above the mine surface and set in a triangular, evenly spaced pattern. The mines were blown in place and left craters 5ft wide and 3ft deep. 3 to 4 lbs of C-4 was used to blow mines.

1130H In the area of YD057656, Co M observed approximately 4 NVA moving in a western direction. The enemy was taken under fire with small arms. The area was searched and an old bunker complex was found at YD058654.

- 1130H In the area of YD056666, Co L at LZ Comet received 8 rounds of incoming. Estimated to be 122mm rockets. Fixed wing was called.
- 1200H Co M began to receive approximately 10 rounds of 122mm rockets from the area of YD051669. Fixed wing was called on the firing positions.
- 1230H In the area of YD056666 and YD035698, all units of 3d Bn, 3d Marines received 4 rounds of unknown caliber incoming.
- 1315H In the area of YD135645, C-2 began to receive 18-20 rounds of rockets and artillery.
- 1850H In the area of YD122622, Co K was taken under fire. Received approximately 30 AK-47 rounds, 4 Chicom grenades, 4 rifle grenades, and 4 60mm rounds from YD086637.
- 2015H In the area of YD12642, Co N heard small arms fire and grenades from the east of their position at about 200-250 meters distant. Some rounds were heard to pass overhead. AK fire was distinctly heard.
- 11 Nov 68 1345H In the area of YD068635, elements of Co M while moving to a new objective, received 20 rounds of 60mm mortars also sniper fire from YD070635. Called in artillery and fired M-60 machine gun at the sniper.
- 1415H In the area of YD0756635, Co M received 31 rounds of 60mm mortars. Called artillery mission on mortar position at YD67627 and YD55643.
- 1550H In the area of YD826638, Co M's point made contact at point blank range with estimated 15 VC. The enemy fired 30 cal automatic weapon. Co M returned fire with small arms. The VC broke contact. Directed gunships and artillery fire on the enemy position. 1 confirmed enemy KIA resulting from contact.
- 12 Nov 68 0051H Elements of Co A 1/3 observed an unknown personnel moving south along outer row of concertina wire. He was wearing what appeared to be a white helmet. Was unable to see if he was in any type of uniform or armed.
- 13 Nov 68 1330H In the area YD130635, 2 indigenous personnel fired AK-47's and rifle grenades at a vehicle heading south on the MSR. Elements of Co K dispatched a squad reinforced by 1 tank. Searched the area with negative results.
- 1745H Between C-9 and C-10, a truck reported taking sniper fire.
- 14 Nov 68 No significant events.

- 15 Nov 68 0700H In the area of YD133637 and YD133636, the engineers on the road sweep discovered 3 anti-tank mines. Two were Russian make and the other was homemade Box Mine. The mines were pressure type. The mines were blown in place.
- 16 Nov 68 0740H In the area of YD133635, elements of Co K received 2 sniper rounds, estimated to be 30 caliber, from the east. The fire was returned with M-79, 60mm mortars, and 90mm, 50cal from the tank. Also called artillery mission.
- 1100H In the area of YD153617, a Vietnamese male (age 14 years) turned in 1 US M-16 rifle, ser# 583842. He was paid 1000 Piasters from the reward fund.
- 1345H In the area YD137620, 3 vehicles moving west received approximately 15 rounds of small arms fire from the east.
- 1830H In the area of YD117638, Co K observed 1 indigenous personnel observing their positions. Fired 106's covering 100m area with unknown results.
- 17 Nov 68 0230H In the area of YD1000704, radar spotted possibly troop movement. Artillery mission called with unknown results.
- 0900H In the area of YD132655, the road sweep discovered 3 mines. 1 was a Chinese Claymore-type mine with pressure device. 1 conventional anti-tank mine in metal container, approximately 5 pounds with plug type pressure device. One box type mine using TNT wrapped in a poncho and using bamboo. One rock marker pointing inboard toward road and one stick pointing inboard toward road. One mine had a small metal washer on dirt over mine. Pulled mines out and made diagrams, then blow in place.
- 1030H In the area of YD133632, a vehicle traveling north was ambushed. Searched area with negative results.
- 1715H In the area of YD135616, elements discovered 1 M-16 rifle; ser# 643803, 1 USMC type pack containing 1 MCI, 1 poncho liner, 1 E-tool, 2 60mm mortar rounds TB type, 1 bandolier of M-16 ammunition. All equipment turned into C-2.
- 18 Nov 68 0800H In the area of YD131638, the road sweep received 15 rounds of 60mm mortar and 9 rounds of small arms fire. Returned fire with 60mm, 81mm mortars and small arms fire.
- 0930H In the area of YD118645, YD118631, C-2 and C-3 began to receive incoming of unknown caliber. C-2 received 15 rounds, C-3 received 14 rounds. Counter battery fire was called.

1725H In the area of YD135633-133634, 1 6x6 truck traveling north on MSR was ambushed from both sides of the road by 30cal machine gun fire and RPG rounds. The truck received 30-50 machine gun rounds and estimated 3 rounds of RPG. Artillery missions were fired also gunships were employed.

19 Nov 68 0930H In the area of YD116615, elements of Co I during the night heard walking inside their perimeter. About 0200H, they saw someone run across the perimeter road and heard additional movement and occupying of bunkers. Someone whistled and all movement stopped. Approximately 10-12 persons were seen. Fired illumination and M-16's to keep the enemy personnel pinned down in the bunkers. Did not fire immediately after sighting because of positions of own personnel. Fired H&I and illumination in hopes of retaining the enemy in the bunker overnight. Ran short of illumination because of the size of our unit. Checked area at first light and discovered that the small arms bunker had been broken into and broke into a case of L's, M-26 grenades, and small arms ammunition. The amount taken is unknown. Checked the wire for entrance with negative results.

1045H In the area of YD133625, 133627, 133628, the road sweep located 3 mines. 1 anti-personnel and 2 anti-tank. The mines were blown in place.

1445H In the area of YD133624, 127622, vehicles moving north were taken under fire by 75-150 rounds of small arms, 2 rounds of RPG's and unknown number of hand grenades. 5-8 persons were spotted 15-30m to the west of the road. Fire was returned with small arms and 81mm mortars. Tanks fired 50cal.

1645H In the area of YD116624, elements of Co I discovered an area recently occupied by a fairly large unit. Fresh trails and approximately 30 fighting holes were found. Fresh blood spot and bandage was found.

20 Nov 68 1030H In the area of YD133635-YD1063 suspected enemy position. The counter-ambush unit received 12 rounds believed to be 82mm mortar. One round to the west of the road and the remainder to the east. Believed to be adjusting on the road. Called tank mission with the assistance of an SO.

1100H In the area of YD116626, elements of Co K observed 2 armed enemy walking along the trail. Took under fire with small arms. Killed one and wounded the other. Captured 1 M-47, 2 30 round magazines loaded, and 2 Chicom grenades. 1 cartridge belt, protein bars, personal gear (letter writing gear, money, and ID card) The uniform was green utilities, regular NVA tennis shoes.

1150H In the area of YD115711, Co L tripped a booby trap. The booby trap area consisted of 20 60mm mortar rounds running east to west about 4-5 meters apart and connected by a trip wire. The area was avoided because of unsafe mass of daisy chain. Artillery was called in on the area.

Conducts road sweeps and demolition/construction operations as directed.
 - (7) Various other combat support and combat service support units occupy positions A-4 and C-2. (See Annex B - Friendly Forces in 3/3 AO.)
2. MISSION 3/3 conducts continuous S/D operations in western portion of AO while maintaining the security of the MSR and positions A-4, C-2, C-2 bridge, and until its closing, C-3.

SECRET3. EXECUTION

- a. Concept Two companies conduct S/D patrols and MSR security operations in eastern portion of AO while 2 companies conduct 2 to 4 day S/D operations in western portion. Fire support will include direct and general support artillery, adjacent friendly units, and fixed wing aircraft. (See Annex C - Operation Overlay)
- b. Co I Provide 1 reinforced platoon for security of positions C-3. Be prepared to conduct 2 to 4 day company (-) S/D operations in SW portion of AO, OR to provide security for positions C-2 and MSR in SE portion of AO.
- c. Co K Provide 1 reinforced platoon for security of C-2 bridge. Be prepared to conduct 2 to 4 day company (-) S/D operations in SW portion of AO, OR to provide security for positions C-2 and MSR in SE portion of AO.
- d. Co L Be prepared to conduct 2 to 4 day S/D operations in NW portion of AO, OR to provide security for positions A-4 and MSR in NE portion of AO.
- e. Co M Be prepared to provide security for position A-4 and MSR in NE portion of AO, OR to conduct 2 to 4 day S/D operations in NW portion of AO.
- f. Coordinating Instructions
- (1) Companies I & K be prepared to conduct company size S/D operations in SW section upon closing of position C-3. Each company will then assume responsibility for C-2 bridge when providing security for C-2 and MSR.
 - (2) Close coordination between unit commanders is directed during position reliefs and commencement of S/D operations.
 - (3) Operations in NW and SW portions of AO will be directed by Company Commanders. The following guidelines apply:
 - (a) Company CP's, platoon patrol bases, ^{and} NO FIRE ZONES, of 3 to 4 grid squares per platoon, will be established. These zones, as well as CP and, if necessary, PPB locations will be closely coordinated in advance with S-3, to include planned relocations. All fires in the NO FIRE ZONES will be controlled by the units therein.
 - (b) Dates and times of commencement and end of S/D operations will be established by frag orders. In general, all operations will commence before BMNT.

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- (c) Coordination with S-3 will be such that the companies operate with maximum flexibility and minimum radio traffic.
- (4) Security operations for MSR and positions A-4, C-2, C-2 bridge, and C-3 will be directed by company commanders. The following guidelines apply.
 - (a) Engineer road sweeps daily, commencing at first light, escorted by 1 squad, plus 2 tanks or 2 dusters. Report commencement, incidents, and completion to Bn COC.
 - (b) Daily patrols, consisting of 1 platoon, functioning as 1, 2, or 3 elements.
 - (c) *Minimum of* One night ambush per company.
 - (d) Two counter-ambush sites along MSR, located as directed and coordinated with S-3. Elements will include at least 2 armored vehicles and 1 squad.
 - (e) Traffic control and security for vehicles on MSR as established by current instructions.
- (5) All units will adhere strictly to current rules of engagement.

4. ADMINISTRATION & LOGISTICS

- a. Administration No change from current SOP's.
 - (1) Admin radio traffic to companies operating in western portion will be cleared by S-3.
- b. Logistics In accordance with current instructions.
 - (1) Companies take minimum rations and equipment on S/D operations.
 - (2) Emergency resupply of Class V will be staged at C-2 for helilift.
 - (3) Medevacs by helilift.

5. COMMAND & COMMUNICATIONS/ELECTRONICS

- a. 3/3 Forward CP at A-4, intermediate CP at C-2.
- b. CP locations of operating units as coordinated with S-3.

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- c. Companies operating in western portion will send absolutely minimum radio traffic. Situation reports at U-S-M-C times will consist of brief acknowledgement of radio check from Bn COC. Send spot reports when necessary.
- d. Routine night and day activities for eastern portion will be reported to Bn COC by 1600H daily.
- e. All units submit spot reports ASAP. Do not delay. Use initial, then final format.
- f. Current standard brevity codes, formats, COI, and thrust points will be used.

1. SUMMARY OF ENEMY SITUATION

- a. The area to the west of the 86th grid line has been occupied to a very limited extent by friendly forces. Trails indicated on Appendix (1) are the result of a limited Reconnaissance effort combined with aerial observers and aerial photo read-outs. This trail overlay is not complete; heavy canopy precludes decisive estimates. A POW captured on 11 October is from the 57th Regt. of the 304th Div., one of the units involved in the KHE SANH siege. The POW indicated that LANG HO (XD774567) is a storage area and also stated that rice caches and aid stations are located in the area to the west. See Appendix (1) for bunker complexes, etc.

2. TERRAIN

- a. The area in our new AO is essentially virgin country. With the exception of the northeastern portion of our AO, friendly intelligence has been minimal. The terrain is extremely steep, inclined to be slick and resistant to ground movement during the wet season. The terrain will likely be rocky, necessitating extremely sure footing. There will be numerous cross compartments and streams not indicated on the map. Streams are likely to be unfordable. Deep draws will hamper communications.

3. WEATHER

- a. Weather during the upcoming operation to the west will make resupply, medevacs, and stream fording difficult and even hazardous. Carrying wounded or sick personnel will slow down movement considerably. November is the transitional month between the Southwest and Northwest monsoons. Approximately 15-20 days per month will receive heavy rains which will inundate ordinarily trafficable regions.
