PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The Battalion continued assigned operations on Operation Taylor Commem. Company patrol bases and Fire Support Bases were established and maintained. Small unit point contacts were frequent, but no large scale, organized resistance was encountered. Numerous bunker complexes and rest areas were discovered and were destroyed. These complexes were unoccupied and for the most part, had been so for several weeks. Numerous weapons and supply caches were also uncovered.

On the 15th of February, the Battalion commenced retrograde operation via An Hoa to Quang Tri Combat Base. On 20 February, the Battalion assumed 2d Bn, 3d Marines AO with the Battalion CP located in Com Lo. Enemy contact was sporadic. There were several mortar and rocket incidents and the Engineers frequently located mines on Route #9.

- (2) During the month of February, the first 15 days Class V was drawn from the LBU in Hoa with no problems encountered. After the 15th, Class V was drawn from 1SP at Quang Tri. A shortage of Claymore mines and M79 UB rounds was encountered.

b. Resupply

During the first 15 days of February, resupply was by helicopter. There were no problems concerning resupply during this period. From the 15th on, resupply was by ground transportation with no problems encountered.

c. Evacuation & Hospitalization

- (1) Areas of operation during Taylor Common were mountainous terrain with double canopy. In the Kentucky AO, terrain is flat with little to no cover.
- (2) All medevacs were by helicopters and no problems were encountered.

d. Transportation

- (1) Total mileage on organic vehicles during February was 6167 miles.
- (2) Truck support in the Hoa area was adequate.
- (3) Truck support in the Kentucky AO was adequate.

e. Service

- (1) During Operation Taylor Common and until 15 February, one platoon of Co B, 3d Engineer Battalion rendered assistance in all engineering tasks. Heavy equipment was unobtainable.
- (2) During the rest of the reporting period, the same platoon conducted road sweeps in the Kentucky AO for the Battalion.
- (3) During the first 15 days of February, the Battalion was supported by 4 HST's from 3d Shore Party Battalion.

10. ADMINISTRATION

- a. During the month of February, 2 SPM were held and 5 Court Martials are pending. The Battalion Commander held 6 Office Hours and 3 are pending. There were 11 Company Commander Office Hours held and 8 are pending.

- b. R&R continued to be a major morale factor. The Battalion received and used 81 Out Of Country R&R quotas. There were no In Country R&R quotas received.
- c. The morale was considered excellent.
- d. Postal Service was fair.
- e. No liberty was authorized during the reporting period.
- f. Marine Exchange facilities were not available to the Battalion as a whole. Limited Exchange was available for the rear area personnel at Nam O and An Hoa for 1-15 February.
- g. The Battalion administration moved back to Quang Tri from Nam O on the 15th of February.

12. INTELLIGENCE

- a. During the first half of the month, the Battalion continued to participate in Operation Taylor Common. As reported in the previous reporting period, enemy contact continued to be point contacts with units of 4-6 men and no all out resistance was encountered. Several bunker and hut complexes were found along with numerous weapons, food and supply caches. These caches indicated that the enemy probably intended to return to the area. There were two (2) incidents of P&B's and units getting hit by mortar, but it is believed that the enemy could not sustain such attacks because of loss of supplies. On the 19th of the month, the Battalion returned north to operate Quang Tri, Cam Lo, and Mai Loc areas during T&P. During this period, one (1) heavy contact indicated that possibly they were preparing for a major offensive. This was substantiated by numerous agent reports and radio intercepts. There were several instances of rocket and mortar attacks indicating the possibility of numerous amounts of supply in the area. Mine sweep teams have uncovered many mines being laid on the MSR's by the enemy in the area.
- b. Scout/Sniper Teams could not be used effectively in the area of An Hoa because of the heavy foliage. In the Cam Lo area, they could be put to better use because of large fields of fire.
- c. Kit Carson Scouts were considered a big help in patrolling, however, the quality of WOP received during Operation Taylor Common was very poor.
- d. Interpreters were considered a big help during the reporting period, however, the Battalion was unable to obtain a sufficient number to put to optimum use.

- e. Dog Teams helped the Battalion greatly during the reporting period. But, like interpreters, are in short supply.

13. COMMUNICATIONS

- a. From 1-15 February, during Operation Taylor Common, communication over difficult terrain was excellent using the Antenna, AS-2236. The AS-2236 provided FM, VHF communications from the Alpha Command Group in the field direct to the Battalion Rear at Nam O Bridge, 40 miles away.
- b. Over the flat lands of our new AO, communications were good using the AS-2236 and HC-292 antennas. Switchboards and telephones were installed in the Alpha Command's new CP at Cam Lo District Headquarters and the Battalion Rear at Quang Tri. The wire section, also installed wire systems at Con Thien and C2 until the US Army moved into these positions at the end of the month.
- c. At the end of the month, plans were formed to establish more direct telephone communications with the Battalion Rear in Quang Tri using the TRC-27B and existing trunks between Dong Ha and Quang Tri.
- d. One of the main problems encountered in the new AO has been that of numerous overrides. Often different battalions have been assigned the same frequencies. Normally, cooperation between the overriding stations permitted continued operation on these frequencies. In rare cases frequencies were changed. Mutual interference between the 27 antennas in the Cam Lo CP was common. Remoting antennas using the AN/GRA-39 or shifting frequencies within the Battalion seemed to be the only solutions to this problem.

JOURNAL SUMMARY

- 01 Feb 69 1415H In the area of ZC061315, a patrol of Co L found 12 huts and several spider traps and tunnels. A search of the area uncovered scraps of paper that were sent to S-2. The area had not been used for 3-4 weeks and was destroyed.
- 1520H In the area of ZC061316, a patrol of Co L found 15 huts with bunkers underneath and several fighting holes. The area had eating facilities and was near a stream and after searching was destroyed.
- 02 Feb 69 1130H In the area of ZC060308, a patrol of Co L found the 3 Recon bodies and assorted gear left in the area.
- 03 Feb 69 0955H In the area of ZC171298, a patrol of Co I made point contact with 4 enemy, who fired on patrol wounding 1. Fire was returned and artillery was called in with negative results.
- 04 Feb 69 1800H In the area of ZC147285, FSB Dart and Co I received 6-7 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. All rounds landed outside the perimeter. Counter mortar fire was used with unknown results.
- 05 Feb 69 1330H In the area of ZC168284, a patrol of Co I found 4 fighting holes and the impression left by an 82mm mortar base plate. Area was destroyed.
- 1500H In the area of ZC081254, a patrol of Co K found a complex of 22 huts and 21 bunkers that were about 1½ years old. Also found a grave with a fence around it, whose occupant had died of natural causes. There were footprints 3 weeks old, but the area had not been used for about 6 months. The area was destroyed.
- 06 Feb 69 1005H In the area of ZC071241, a patrol of Co K found 8 fighting holes set in a 360° perimeter and assorted NVA equipment. The holes were about a week old and were destroyed.
- 1115H In the area of ZC075247, a Marine of Co K patrol set off a booby trap made from an M26 grenade resulting in 3 medevacs.
- 1345H In the area of ZC140297, a patrol of Co I found 10 huts with bunkers underneath. Two were messhalls containing cooking utensils. Also found were enemy weapons, ammunition, and medical equipment. The weapons and equipment was sent to S-2 and the rest destroyed.
- 07 Feb 69 1030H In the area of ZC170287, a patrol of Co I made point contact with 3 enemy with automatic weapons. Returned fire with unknown results. Searched area and found NVA equipment.

1600H In the area of ZC 105347, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 4 huts and 4 bunkers with many trails leading from the area. The complex was 8 months old and had not been used within the last month. The area was destroyed.

08 Feb 69 In the area of ZC 185310, a Marine on patrol with Co I sat on an enemy mine and was killed.

0915H In the area of ZC 097399, a patrol of Co M made point contact with 5 enemy heading in the opposite direction. Fired on the enemy, killing 1. Searched the area and found enemy weapons and equipment.

1200H In the area of ZC 093346, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 9 huts, 1 messhall hut, 13 bunkers, and 3 latrines. The area was 5 months old and had been used within the last week. The complex was destroyed.

1600H In the area of ZC 184316, a patrol of Co I found 33 pits for cooking. The pits could be covered to smoke food. The area had not been used recently and was destroyed.

1700H In the area of ZC 184316, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 7 huts with bunkers underneath. 1 hut was a messhall and 1 was an aid station. In the huts were found enemy ammunition, farming tools, communications equipment, and other articles. Everything was destroyed.

09 Feb 69 0930H In the area of ZC 189303, a patrol of Co I was taken under fire by an unknown number of enemy, while crossing a stream. Returned fire with negative results.

1015H In the area of ZC 087346, a patrol of Co M found 8 huts with bunkers underneath, 1 hut was a messhall and 1 was an aid station. The area was 6-8 months old and had used within the last 3-4 days. The complex was destroyed.

1200H In the area of ZC 050314, a patrol of Co L found 3 huts containing a large amount of food and some clothing. The huts were destroyed.

1245H In the area of ZC 174285, a patrol of Company I was taken under fire by an automatic weapon and sustained 3 medevacs. Returned fire and called in artillery with unknown results. Searched area and found 6 freshly dug fighting holes.

1430H In the area of ZC 171284, a patrol of Co I made point contact with 1 enemy, who opened fire on patrol killing 2 Marines. Patrol returned fire killing 1 NV and capturing his rifle.

1730H In the area of ZC177288, a patrol of Co I sighted 5 enemy moving along a trail. Called in artillery with unknown results.

1930H In the area of ZC171283, Co I received 5-6 60mm mortar rounds from an unknown position. The rounds caused no injury.

2150H In the area of ZC092337, an SF of Co M heard movement in front of the lines. Marines threw grenades with negative results other than 1 bouncing off a tree and injuring 2 Marines.

10 Feb 69 No significant events.

11 Feb 69 1300H In the area of ZC027255, a patrol of Co L made point contact with 2 enemy. Fired upon enemy with unknown results.

1330H In the area of ZC064265, a patrol of Co K found a cultivated area with corn, banana trees, potatoes, and other assorted vegetables. Also found were 28 pigs that were being raised. The had been used recently and was destroyed.

12 Feb 69 0930H In the area of ZC064265, a patrol of Co K found 2 huts containing Chinese maps and documents. The maps and documents were sent to S-2 and the huts destroyed.

1130H In the area of ZC064269, a patrol of Co K found 3 huts and 2 bunkers. They also found 1 bamboo canoe, 5 empty 82mm mortar boxes, bicycle parts, and a cultivated area. Everything was destroyed.

1430H In the area of ZC058316, a patrol of Co L found 3 graves with 1 female and 2 males. The graves were 3-6 months old.

1600H In the area of ZC061323, a patrol of Co M found a complex of 8 huts with eating facilities. Searching the area uncovered 35 knap sacks, 13 maps, ammunition pouches, Chicom voltage meters, a whip antenna, 4 cans of grease, telegraph cable, 30 transformers, 3 MVA cartridge belts, 20 heavy duty fuses, and a small amount of food. The equipment was sent to S-2 and the rest destroyed.

13 Feb 69 1300H In the area of ZC990344, a patrol of Co G, 2/5 found a grave with 1 body killed by artillery.

1545H In the area of ZC025272, a patrol of Co F, 2/5 found 5 huts. One was a messhall and two had bunkers underneath. Also found was miscellaneous medical equipment and documents. The complex was destroyed.

1630H In the area of ZC061289, a patrol of Co L found a small trail, 3 very old huts, and a small footbridge. Also found a bicycle seat in one hut. Area was destroyed.

- 14 Feb 69 0900H In the area of XC065287, a patrol of Co L found several trails and bridges capable of handling 4 wheel vehicles. It had not been used recently.
- 1215H In the area of XC04829, a patrol of Co L made contact with 1 enemy. Enemy broke contact and fled NW. Artillery was called with unknown results.
- 1219H In the area of XC05393, a patrol of Co L found a very old bridge made of concrete and steel. The bridge was destroyed.
- 1400H In the area of XC074283, a patrol of Co L found 3 huts with bunkers underneath. Also found were 16 K44 rifles, 7 9mm machine guns, 1 Chicom LMG, 2 Chicom BAR's, and several assorted magazines and rounds of ordnance. The complex was destroyed.
- 1750H In the area of XC041300, a patrol of Co M found a grave with 1 body that was killed by artillery.
- 15 Feb 69 0800H Started to helilift from Base Area 112 to return to Quang Tri Combat Base.
- 16 Feb 69 0800H Co L under OPCOM of 1st Bde, 5th Mech Div USA deployed north of Dong Ha
- 17 Feb 69 0800H Co I under OPCOM of Senior Advisor, Quang Tri Province deployed to Quang Tri City.
- 18 Feb 69 0800H Co M deployed to Con Thien.
- 19 Feb 69 0800H The Battalion started to deploy to the Cam Lo and Huong Hoa Districts.
- 20 Feb 69 1200H Assumed the 2d Bn, 3d Marines AC and began operations.
- 1500H In the area of YD1268, a patrol of Co K apprehended one civilian. He turned out to be a civilian hunter. He was turned over to MACV personnel and was released.
- 2240H In the area of YD182587, elements of the 106 Plt received small arms fire from the village Thou Dinh Ya. they fired illumination and the firing stopped.
- 2320H In the area of YD182587, elements of the 106 Plt heard movement under the bridge. They throw 2 M26 grenades. Checked area with negative results.
- 21 Feb 69 0915H In the area of YD073573, the engineers received an unknown number of mortar rounds, believed to be 82mm.
- 1010H In the area of YD037564, a jeep in a convoy from VCB hit a mine and the jeep following it received automatic weapon fire

Also mortar fire was received from the YD0558 area. A platoon with a section of tanks was sent to check out the area and found 25 Montegards, who were released.

1410H In the area of YD096613, a patrol of Co H, 2/3 discovered 13 60mm rounds, 1 empty can of increments, and 1 battle dressing wrapper.

1730H In the area of YD133670, the engineers were destroying a 250 pound bomb when the charge set off a secondary explosion. It was believed that the bomb was booby trapped.

22 Feb 69 1030H In the area of YD188615, a bulldozer of Co C, 14th Engr, USA hit a mine disabling it. It was sent to the rear for repair.

1645H In the area of YD188615, Co C, 14th Engr, USA had a road grader strike a mine. It was sent to the rear for repair.

23 Feb 69 1300H In the area of YD174687, elements of Co K with a tank and 2 APC's and an A0 on station, were taken under fire by 16 NVA, who were taken under fire by 90mm, rockets, artillery, and small arms. Another platoon of Co K with 6 tanks and 4 APC's was dispatched. The units linked up and swept the area finding 4 NVA KIA, 1 NVA POW, and 17 fighting holes. Further searching discovered 2 AK47's, 1 AK50, 5 AK magazines, 1 poncho, 3 NVA helmets, 1 belt, 1 map and a sketch of the ambush site, 1 canteen, 4 Chicom grenades, and 2 pens.

1400H In the area of YD183614, an Army 10 ton truck hit a mine on the road. The truck was retrieved for repair.

1530H In the area of YD165685, elements of 3d Squadron, 5th Mech, USA discovered 2 bodies which appeared to have been killed by an air strike. Also found 1 Chicom grenade.

1830H In the area of YD085618, elements of Co U, 2/3 received 10-12 60mm mortar rounds. Artillery mission was called on suspected area with unknown results.

2045H In the area of YD103522, elements of Co F, 2/3 sighted figures moving near a village. Challenged them and received fire. Returned fire and call in an 81mm mortar mission. Searching the area after uncovered 1 AK47, 1 bloody sandal, 1 bloody walking stick. Another search will be made at first light.

24 Feb 69 In the area of YD103522, a patrol of Co F, 2/3 continued their search of the area and found 2 NVA KIA, 1 AK47, 4 Chicom grenades, 5 magazines, and other assorted gear.

1030H In the area of YD095616, a patrol of Co H, 2/3 discovered 1 T mine, and a cooking bunker constructed so the smoke couldn't be seen. The bunker was 6 months old and had not been used for 3 months. It was destroyed.

1915H In the area of YD131529, an ambush of Co F, 2/3 using a SID in conjunction with a chain of claymores, detected movement. The claymores were detonated killing 1 NVA/VC. Searching the area discovered a Chicom battle dressing and 100 plasters.

25 Feb 69 0255H In the area of YD091503, Co H, 2/3 received a probe by an unknown number of enemy using small arms and grenades. Fire was returned and a 81mm mortar mission was called with unknown results.

0815H In the area of YD148681, elements of Co K while in an ambush position observed 1 NVA. The ambush opened fire as another one appeared. 2 tanks and duster were called in to assist. Also called in artillery to block escaped routes. The units linked up and swept the area killing 4 NVA out of an estimated 10-15 enemy. Also found were pairs of utilities and jungle boots.

0902H In the area of YD004593, a patrol of Co H, 2/3 continued the search of the area after the 0255H. They found 10 huts partially destroyed by satchel charges and 2 AK47's, 1 32mm pistol, 11 AK magazines, 40-45 TNT blocks, Chicom grenades, and 5 NVA RT's.

1240H In the area of YD119710, OP#2 of Con Thien observed a sniper. The enemy was fired upon by dusters with unknown results.

1450H In the area of YD136645, elements of Co K received 8 122mm rockets. Artillery was called in on the suspected enemy positions of YD060650, YD056668, and YD070636 with unknown results.

1745H In the area of YD127655, elements of Co K observed 8 140mm rocket rounds landing between C2 and C2 bridge. Artillery fire was called in with unknown results.

1745H In the area of YD118603, elements of Co H, 2/3 received 8-10 rounds of 60mm mortar. Used counter mortar fire with unknown results.

2030H In the area of YD081519, elements of the USA CIDG received 2 rounds of 810 from the northwest. Also small arms fire. Returned fire with unknown results.

26 Feb 69 0830H In the area of YD128613, Co K had 15 rounds of 82mm mortar land 200-700m outside their perimeter from unknown sources.

0910H In the area of YD088602, elements of Co C, 3d Engr and MC358 found an exploding device consisting of a blasting cap and 3 1/2 lb blocks of TNT. The device was destroyed.

1100H In the area of YD011565, elements of Co C, 3d Engr on a road sweep found 2 indigenous personnel. One had an ID card and the other was turned over to the District Police after finding out he was an ex-NVA.

1315H In the area of YD119714, OP# 2 had 6 rounds fired at him by a sniper. Artillery was called in on the position with unknown results.

1430H In the area of YD086597, a patrol of Co H, 2/3 found 5 TNT charges, surettes of unknown substance, and 1 bottle of dehydrated food on a trail. The items were destroyed.

1600H In the area of YD170620, a patrol of Co K found a 250lb bomb at the land clearing site. Engineers blew it in place.

1915H In the area of YD128512, an ambush of Co F, 2/3 received 7 60mm mortar rounds while sitting in for the night. Counter mortar fire was called with unknown results.

27 Feb 69 0430H In the area of YD128643, a patrol of Co K observed 15 rounds of crew served weapons fire.

1530H In the area of YD025525, elements of CIDG had contact with a platoon of NVA/VC. Returned fire and called in artillery with negative results.

1000H In the area of YD09196161, elements of Co H, 2/3 received 15-18 rounds of 60mm mortar. Fire was returned with tanks and artillery with unknown results.

28 Feb 69 1000H In the area of YD080578, elements of Co B, 3d Engr, while sweeping the road, had a small boy give them 19 1/2 pounds of TNT. The boy was given a VIP payment.

1030H In the area of YD064571, elements of Co C, 3d Engr found an AT mine, but failed to find the second one, 50-75m down the road. A truck following the sweep set off the second mine rendering it inoperable. The mine was believed to be a Russian plastic AT mine.

1100H In the area of YD062571 to YD070571, Road Sweep Team 407 found 3 AT mines approximately 50-75m apart. The mines were blown in place.

1520H In the area of YD0962, elements of Co H, 2/3, Co B Tanks, and 1st Bde USA made contact with an enemy force of about a reinforced platoon. Two tanks were disabled in the contact by RPG. After contact was broken, fixed wing and artillery was called in with unknown results.

1600H In the area of YD095615, a tank hit an AT mine and was disabled. Elements of Co H, 2/3 provided security until the tank was returned to Co B, Tanks CF.
