PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. GENERAL OVERALL VIEW OF ALL ACTIVITIES. During the period of 1-13 August, the Battalion operated from the Cam Lo District Headquarters and stable positions to the north. From 14-31 August, the Battalion operated from Elliot Combat Base and 8 company-size search and clear operations were conducted. The Battalion continued to emphasize night movement, logistic self-sufficiency, minimum dependence on helicopter support, and prolonged small unit patrols and ambushes. Development and improvement of the fixed positions as well as mine sweeps of Route #9 and Route #561 continued to demand a large part of the Battalion's effort.

Enemy contact was generally of small scale and brief in duration. There was emphasis on close air support, TPQ's, and Beacon strikes throughout the month. Ambushes during this reporting period were very successful. Mortar attacks were minimal throughout the reporting month.

The Battalion S-5 worked throughout the month with local civilians with Ned CAPs in conjunction with RVN authorities.

3. MISSIONS ASSIGNED.

- a. Regimental Frag Order 93-69

(1) On 28 July begin south and eastward sweep with exploitation force in order to reposition forces in new AO by 30 July. Upon reorientation, conduct S/D operations in AO with primary emphasis in north and central Leatherneck Square and secondary emphasis on maintaining pressure against 1/11's southeastern boundary.

(2) Be prepared to pass OPCON of security force at A-4 to 1/11 for night of 28-29 July. Unit will return to 3/3's new AO and OPCON upon relief 29 July in AM.

(3) On 30 July transport and release H/2/3 back to OPCON of 2/3.

(4) Maintain battalion in a posture for helicopter redeployment anywhere in the division AO on four (4) hours notice.

- b. Regimental Frag Order 94-69

(1) No change.

- c. Regimental Frag Order 95-69

(1) Continue assigned missions in AO.

(2) 041200H August assume responsibility for additional AO from First Battalion.

(3) At 1200H on 1 August commence extensive S/D operations in Cam Hung area. (Upper left AO, lower right 1060.)

- d. Regimental Frag Order 96-69

(1) On D-day, commence operations in assigned AO.

(2) On order, assume responsibility for new AO and commence S/D operations.

(3) Provide (1) company for security of Elliot CB to include Third Marines CP.

(4) Provide security for Route #9, road construction crews, and equipment in AO.

(5) Provide security for road sweeps emanating from Elliot CB within AO.

e. Regimental Frag Order 97-69

(1) No change.

f. Regimental Frag Order 98-69

(1) Commencing at H-hour, D-day attack to the north with three (3) companies to destroy the enemy, asses grand slam, and gather intelligence information.

(2) Continue to provide normal security for Elliot CB and Route #9 in AO.

(3) On 18 Aug, assume OPCON of one (1) platoon from 2d Battalion for security of FSB Pete.

(4) When directed on 18 Aug, provide one (1) platoon for the security of road sweep from Route #9 to FSB Pete.

g. Regimental Frag Order 99-69

(1) Conduct extensive, deliberate, and thorough combat patrolling in assigned AO to find, fix, and destroy the enemy and to gather intelligence information.

(2) Continue to provide normal security for Elliot CB and Route #9 in AO.

(3) Assume OPCON of Co D, 1st Bn, 4th Marines approximately 18 1500H Aug 69. Duration of OPCON, approximately four (4) days.

h. Regimental Frag Order 100-69

(1) Continue previously assigned mission.

(2) On order 24 August 69, pass OPCON of 1st platoon, Company G to 2d Battalion.

(3) By 24 August 69, with one (1) company, be prepared to conduct S/D operations in southwest quadrant of AO using helicopter or surface means.

(4) Commencing on 24 August 69, conduct S/D operations with a minimum of one (1) company along infiltration routes between E-W 59 and 61 grid lines.

4. INTELLIGENCE.

a. During the month, the Battalion was involved in Operation Idaho Canyon. Enemy activity was light to moderate. There were 9 contacts with the enemy during the month, the most significant taking place on the 22d in the Mutters Ridge area.

b. Unit Identification. Documents captured on 22 August identified the presence of the first and second companies of the 2d Bn, 9th Regt, 304 Div.

b. Resupply. During August, resupply was by helicopters and trucks. No problems were encountered with helicopter resupply, however truck availability was occasionally inadequate to support the Battalion.

c. Evacuation & Hospitalization. All medevacs were by helicopters and no problems were encountered.

d. Transportation.

(1) Total mileage on organic vehicles during August was 17,787.

9. COMMUNICATIONS & ELECTRONICS.

a. During the month, communication remained excellent. On the 13th, the Battalion CP moved to Elliot CB and a relay station was set up on the Rockpile to improve communication to the Battalion Rear in Dong Ha.

b. MF/PRCS were put in use for line security of the Battalion CP's position and worked quite favorably.

c. A series of bad lots of BA386/U continued to be encountered.

d. It was found that the guy lines for the Antenna AS2236 were inadequate when placed near helicopter landing zones or during high winds. It is felt that an extra set should be placed at the top of the dielectric and the remaining ones be placed lower on the mast.

10. EQUIPMENT. Combat essential equipment at OP on 31 August 1969.

11. CIVIC ACTION.

a. During the month, the Battalion S-5 assisted in 2 Med CAPs. These CAPs were combined projects with the Medical Staff and S-5 Officer of the 2d ARVN Regt. The Med CAPs treated 288 Vietnamese. 3 Vietnamese were medevaced during the month.

- 1130H In the area of XD 947630 a member of Co M found 1 Marine body (PC-8038), 1 NVA helmet, covers with markings, 2 NVA IAK47 magazines, 6 NVA gasmasks and 4 first aid packets. The gear was sent to Regt.
- 1715H In the area of XD947636 a member of Co L received 2 60mm mortar rounds 100m from their artillery used on suspected enemy position. An AO was called and destroyed with unknown results.
- 21 Aug 1800H In the area of XD938628 a member of Co L found 2 partially buried bodies about two weeks old, a serviceable gasmask, and 40 C4 grenades.
- 2050H In the area of XD955575 a member of Co K observed what appeared to be 10 amber lights on a pole and a 106mm RR and dusters at own results.
- 22 Aug 0845H In the area of XD936565 a member of Co K found a dud AP mine lodged in place. 1000H In the area of XD938653 and XD938654 an enemy bunkers were destroyed by explosions and fires.
- 1130H In the area of XD932662 a member of Co L made point contact with an estimated NVA squad, green utilities, pith helmets and carrying IAK47's, small arms and called in mortar and gunships were also called. 4 Marine WIA.

1630-2230 In the area of XD934627 elements of Co L made contact with 2 reinforced NVA platoons in extremely steep terrain with heavy vegetation. The NVA were in well constructed and camouflaged bunkers and maintained fire superiority with 2 30cal machineguns, AK47's and Chicoms. Contact was broken with the help of gunships. Artillery called in with unknown results. There was 8 NVA KIA, 1 Kit Carson Scout WIA, 6 Marine KIA and 11 NIA.

0730H In the area of XD935627 elements of Co L deployed to sweep area of last night's contact and discovered 23 bunkers, 18 had been destroyed by artillery and fixed wing. All were connected by trenchlines. Area was littered with bloody NVA battle dressings, bloody clothing, and several blood trails. Results of the search were 2 NVA KIA, 4 AK47's, 3 SKS's, 1 60MM sight, 3 Chicom grenades, and a torn shirt with writing on it. The bunkers and gear was destroyed and the shirt sent to Regt. S-2.

0927H In the area of XD946624 elements of Co I observed 2 82mm mortar rounds impact 100m from their position. Negative action was taken.

0930H In the area of XD938627 elements of Co L observed 10 82mm mortar rounds impact 20m outside of their position. Artillery was called on the suspected enemy position with unknown results.

1132H In the area of XD938627 elements of Co L received 5 82mm mortar rounds. One landed inside a fighting hole resulting in 1 Marine KIA and 6 WIA. An AO was called and directed fixed wing and artillery on suspected enemy position resulting in 5 secondary explosions and 2 bunkers destroyed.

1230H In the area of XD933627, XD932646, and XD944646 the Bn Air Liaison ran 5 flights of fixed wing on suspected enemy position resulting in 23 bunkers destroyed, 1 mortar position destroyed and 2 secondary explosion.

2040H In the area of XD984543 elements of Co K fired M79's at movement when trip flares were set off with negative results.

2245H In the area of XD961542 elements of Co K observed 5 NVA. The enemy were taken under fire with unknown results at this time. Area to be checked out.

24 Aug 0001H In the area of XD961542 elements of Co K checked area of 232245H sighting and found 1 WIA, 1 AK47, 2 Chicom grenades, 1 AK47 magazine, 1 canister, 1 protein bar, and a metal tag with B-4 on it. The tag was sent to S-2 and the rest of the gear was destroyed.

0700- 1130H In the area of XD936627, XD933631, and XD928635 the Bn Air Liaison ran 4 flights of fixed wing on suspected enemy position resulting in 18 bunkers and 1 mortar pit destroyed, 14 bunkers damaged, 1 cave uncovered, and 1 secondary explosion.

0845 In the area of XD961542 elements of Co K swept through the area of last night's activity and found what appeared to be a NVA ambush site with 13 Chicom Claymores still in place. The mines were blown in place.

25 Aug 0830H In the area of XD953621 elements of Co L observed 2 60mm mortar rounds land 300m outside their perimeter as a helicopter was landing. Artillery was called with unknown results.

26 Aug 1515H In the area of XD977556 elements of Co K observed 1 round of unknown size landed near them. An AO was requested to check the area. Results unknown.

27 Aug 0020H In the area of XD961536 elements of Co L received 12 105mm rounds from the direction of Elliot CB. A check fire was called. There was 1 USN KIA and 1 WIA, 7 Marine-WIA.

28 Aug No significant events.

29 Aug 1710H In the area of XD966647 an AO ran a TPQ on a suspected enemy position resulting in 1 NVA KBA

1800H In the area of XD975598 elements of Co M found a well used trail along a stream. The trail was straddled with 20 spider holes 10m apart, some used recently. Also found were 2 82mm fuze containers, and 1 cooking utensil. The holes and gear was destroyed.

30 Aug 1030H In the area of XD975598 elements of Co M followed a trail found previous day for about 400m. There was NVA comm wire along the trail but not connected to anything.

31 Aug No significant events.
