PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. GENERAL OVERALL VIEW OF ALL ACTIVITIES. During the period of 1-21 Sep, the Battalion operated from the Elliot CB and company size S/D operations were conducted.

The Battalion continued to emphasize night movement, logistical self-sufficiency, minimum dependence on helicopter support, and prolonged small unit patrols and ambushes. Development and improvement of fixed positions as well as mine sweeps of Route 9 continued to demand a large part of the Battalion's time.

Enemy contact was generally small scale and of brief duration with the exception of 17 Sep when Co L was assaulted by an estimated 2 companies of NVA. Heavy 82mm mortar fire was received by the Battalion a total of 7 times during the reporting period.

There was emphasis on close air support, TPQ's, and beacon strikes during the month. The Bn S-5 worked throughout the month helping local civilians, who had property damaged from a storm early in the month.

 - (2) On order 24 Aug 69, with one (1) company, be prepared to conduct S/D operations in southwest quadrant of AO using helicopter or surface means.
 - (3) On order 24 Aug 69, pass OPCON of 1st platoon, Company G to 2d Battalion.
 - (4) Commencing on 24 Aug 69, conduct S/D operations with a minimum of one (1) company along infiltration routes between E-W 59 and 61 grid lines.
- b. Regimental Frag Order 101-69
 - (1) Continue normal operations with the exception of conducting no ground offensive operations unless necessary.

4. INTELLIGENCE.

a. During the reporting period, the Battalion continued Operation Idaho Canyon. Enemy activity was heavy to moderate. There were 6 significant contacts with the enemy between 12 and 19 Sep, the most significant taking place on the 19th in the Kutter's Ridge area, with an estimated company of NVA.

b. Unit Identification. During the reporting period, documents that were captured revealed the presence of the 9th Regt, 304 NVA Div.

c. Capture of munitions after a friendly ambush fired on NVA on Route #9 south of the Rockpile revealed a new technique in the use of the Chinese AP Claymore mine to explode in the air. This device consisted of 2 of the mines stacked with a sandbag buffer between. Upon command detonation of the first mine, the second is hurled 5-10m in the air and detonated.

b. Resupply. During September, resupply was by helicopters and trucks. No problems were encountered with helicopter resupply, however truck availability was occasionally inadequate to support the Battalion.

c. Evacuation & Hospitalization. All medevacs were by helicopters and no problems were encountered.

d. Transportation.

(1) Total mileage on organic vehicles during the reporting period was 19,287 miles.

(2) Truck support was inadequate.

9. COMMUNICATIONS.

a. No problems in communications was encountered during the reporting period.

b. AN/PRC88's were put in use for line security of the Battalion's CP at Elliot CB and worked quite favorably.

c. Series of bad lots of BA386/U continued to be uncovered.

10. EQUIPMENT. Combat essential equipment at 83% on 21 September 1969.

11. CIVIC ACTION. During the reporting period, the 2-5 furnished sandbags to civilians in the tropical storm at the first of the month. They also donated 3 cases of toys for a festival on 26 September.

(6) Marine Exchange facilities were not available to the Battalion as a whole. Limited Exchange facilities were available for the rear area personnel. The personnel forward were supplied with SP's.

JOURNAL SUMMARY

- 01 Sep 0910H In the area of XD956627 elements of Co I fired 81mm mortars on a suspected enemy position and observed 3 secondary explosions.
- 02 Sep 0030-0145H In the area of XD965616 elements of Co I heard 28-30 rounds impact near FSB Mack.
- 03 Sep 1000H In the area of XD942673 an AO observed new bunkers. Called artillery on the area which resulted in 13 bunkers and 2 50cal pits destroyed, and 1 NVA KIA.
- 04 Sep 1400H In the area of XD946601 elements of Co M observed 1 NVA stringing wire on a trail. He was killed by the company. The wire led to 2 Claymore mines 100m from Co M's perimeter. Results were 1 NVA KIA, 2 Chicom grenades, 1 NVA canteen, 1 grenade pouch, 1 belt, 1 medical kit, 6 Chicom Claymores, 12 blasting caps, 1 letter, 1 newspaper captured.
- 1650H In the area of XD963624 elements of Co I observed 1 NVA and called 81mm mortars and artillery with unknown results.
- 1900H In the area of XD942616 elements of Co M observed 14 60mm rounds impact 400m from their position. Mortar and artillery fire was return with unknown results.
- 05 Sep 0530-0800H In the area of XD961617 elements of Co I heard movement around their position. At 0630 1 NVA thought to be point for a larger unit was spotted and taken under fire. Artillery and 3 flights of fixed wing was called in on the area. Results were 3 NVA POW, 2 AK47's, 1 RPG, 100 AK47 rounds, 3 RPG rounds, 39 Chicoms, 4 AK-47 magazines, 5 canteens, 4 belts, 1 knife, 2 knife sheaths, 3 gas masks, 5 battle dressings, and documents and letters. POW's were medivaced.
- 1030H In the area of XD946602 elements of Co M found a Claymore mine tied in a tree with wire leading down a trail to 7 fighting holes. Area was searched resulting in 1 claymore, 2 packs, 1 Chicom, 2 gas masks, 2 bowls, 2 sets of utilities, 1 first aid pack, 2 helmets, and documents.
- 1440H In the area of XD978637 elements of Co I observed 4 rounds of 60mm mortar impact 500 meters from their position. Artillery and 1 flight of fixed wing was called in on the suspected enemy position.
- 1600H In the area of XD967637 Elements of Co I observed 2 rounds of 60mm mortar impact 300 meters from their position. Artillery and 2 flights of fixed wing was called in on the suspected enemy position. AO observed 2 secondary explosions caused by the artillery.
- 1700H In the area of XD978637 and XD955635 an AO directed 2 flights of fixed wing and 2 artillery missions. The results were 3 fighting holes destroyed, 12 bunkers destroyed, 4 secondary explosions.
- 1900H In the area of XD969 3 elements of Co I retrieved 45 rounds of 82mm mortar from at least 2 mortars. Artillery was called in and AO adjusted.

- 06 Sep 0730H In the area of XD982612 elements of Co I found 3 RPG launcher carrying cases and destroyed them.
- 0725H In the area of XD982547 Elliot Combat Base received one 122mm rocket. Crater analysis was taken. AO directed artillery mission.
- 1845H In the area of XD974616 elements of Co I saw 2 NVA moving south. Artillery mission called in with unknown results.
- 07 Sep 1410H In the area of XD969618 elements of Co I found 1 60mm mortar round (US) tied to a tree with detonating cord. Cord led to a clump of leaves about 25 down the trail. Engineers blew round in place.
- 1720H In the area of XD 974515 elements of Co I observed 2 NVA. Mortars and artillery were called in with unknown results. AO observed.
- 1730H In the area of XD973597 elements of Co K found an M16 rifle #552413. Rifle was sent to the rear.
- 1807H In the area of XD975623 elements of Co I observed 2 NVA walking east on trail. Artillery was called in with unknown results.
- 08 Sep No significant events.
- 09 Sep 0833H In the area of XD963628 AO observed 2 new bunkers. Fresh trail and tunnel was observed at XD928626. At XD916628 to XD937628 a fresh trail was observed. Negative action was taken due to present restrictions.
- 1820H In the area of XD945321 elements of Co I observed 6 NVA in utilities. Negative action was taken due to present restrictions.
- 1915H In the area of XD978558 elements of a radio relay team observed one NVA headed northeast. Team threw grenades and fired M79 HE rounds. Result was 1 NVA canteen.
- 10 Sep 0735H In the area of XD950621 elements of Co I were ambushed by an NVA squad using command detonated booby traps and small arms. Co I returned fire with small arms, M60, 60mm mortar, and M79 and withdrew. AO requested support of fixed wing. Artillery and 81mm mortars were fired on NVA bunkers. Results were 1 USMC KIA, 7 NVA KIA, 1 AKM, 20 picoms, 24 blocks of TNT, 11 RPG rounds, 8 blasting caps, 360 F20 rounds, 3 RPG boosters, 100 machinegun rounds, 7 AK47 magazines, 1 machinegun magazine, 3 gas masks, 2 helmets, 100 yards of electric wire, 4 first aid boxes, 1 mortar level, 8 packs, 200 yards rope, 2 canteens, 1 set demolition trip device, food including 21 protein bars, and documents and letters.

- 0620H In the area of XD946624 elements of Co I received 4 rounds of sniper fire. An AO checked the area with negative results.
- 11 Sep 0908H In the area of XD968618 elements of Co I observed 1 NVA and took him under fire with 60mm mortars. An AO ran a flight of fixed wing and called in artillery with unknown results.
- 12 Sep 0815H In the area of XD993601 elements of Co I observed footprints of 5 men heading west on a trail. Swept area with negative results.
- 1810H In the area of XD960616 elements of Co K made contact with 4-5 NVA, who retreated northwest. Artillery and fixed wing were called in with unknown results.
- 1830H In the area of XD949621 elements of Co K received 50 60mm mortar rounds over a period of 2 hours. Artillery and a C47 gunship were called in with unknown results. There were 1 Marine KIA and 5 WIA.
- 1915H In the area of XD954621 elements of Co K received 10 82mm mortar rounds from what appeared to be 2 positions. Artillery and 81mm mortar fire was returned with unknown results. There were 1 USMC KIA and 4 WIA.
- 13 Sep 1200H In the area of XD952594 elements of Co H found 22 82mm mortar rounds placed in shallow holes. The rounds were destroyed in place.
- 1350H In the area of XD942605 elements of Co L found protein bar wrappers approximately 1-2 days old. Also sighted 1 NVA moving north and fired on him with unknown results.
- 1905H In the area of XD944610 elements of Co L stopped as a scout dog alerted. A HHO was brought up and the NVA opened fire with small arms, Chicons, and RPG's. The point withdrew and began to receive 82mm mortar. Artillery, 81mm mortars, and a C47 gunship was called in on the enemy position. Results of the contact were 1 NVA KIA, 2 USMC KIA, and 19 USMC WIA. Captured were 100 AK47 rounds, 5 RPG rounds, 12 Chicon grenades, 1 Chicon Claymore, 10 packs, 6 E-tools, 40lb rice, 6 gasmasks, 2 helmets, 60 blasting caps, and 2 RPD drums.
- 14 Sep 0715H In the area of XD945617 elements of Co L were fired on by 2 NVA with AK47's. The NVA then ran into a draw. An AO ran fixed wing on the area with unknown results.
- 0735H In the area of XD908565 elements of Co I road sweep team found 8 Chicon Claymores, 2 packs, 1 NVA poncho, and 1 NVA flag. All gear was retrieved by elements of another unit.
- 1312H In the area of XD955613 elements of Co K observed 5 NVA in the open. An AO ran fixed wing on the enemy with unknown results.
- 1545H In the area of XD955613 elements of Co K received 6 rounds of 82mm mortar. An AO ran fixed wing on the enemy position with unknown results.

- 1500H In the area of XD934618, XD944617, and XD949634 an AO ran 7 flights of fixed wing killing 1 NVA, 1 L/W pit destroyed, 2 sustained fires, 2 secondary explosions, and 3 bunkers damaged.
- 15 Sep 0830H In the area of XD950621 elements of Co K were ambushed by a reinforced NVA platoon. The enemy used 30cal machinogun, AK47's, Chicoms, RPG's, and Claymore mines hung in trees. Forty-five minutes after contact, the unit began to receive 60mm mortar rounds for a period of 4 hours, totalling 50 rounds. The unit pulled back and called in artillery, 81mm mortars, gunships, and fixed wing. Results of the contact were 8 NVA KIA, 4 USMC KIA, and 36 USMC WIA.
- 16 Sep 0845H In the area of XD964598 elements of Co L observed 1 NVA moving northeast. Artillery and mortars were used on the NVA with unknown results.
- 1000H In the area of XD956633 an AO ran 5 flights of fixed wing resulting in 11 bunkers destroyed, 1 50cal pit destroyed, and 1 NVA KBA.
- 1730H In the area of XD974615 elements of Co M received 12 82mm mortar rounds just outside their perimeter. An AO was called and ran artillery on the area with unknown results.
- 17 Sep 0030H In the area of XD951597 elements of Co L were subject to a heavy ground attack. The NVA initiated fire using RPG and Chicoms. At 0205H the perimeter was breached by the NVA. The perimeter was reestablished but the unit continued to receive heavy volumes of small arms fire, Chicoms, RPG's, and machinogun fire from the northeast. Under the fire the enemy crawled to within 10 feet of the perimeter but were repulsed. Results of the contact were 23 NVA KIA, 13 USMC KIA, 3 USN KIA, 23 USMC WIA, and 1 USN WIA. Captured were 2 RPD's, 1 RPG2, 1 RPG7, 10 AK47's, 1 RPG7 sight, 1 satchel charge, and 16 Chicom grenades.
- 0850H In the area of XD944618 elements of Co I, 3/4 landed at LZ Cardinal and moved south to set up a blocking force. At 1320H the point made contact with an unknown size enemy force resulting in 5 Marine KIA and 17 WIA. The unit then pulled back to XD944613. Medevac helicopters were called in and at 1409H the unit began to receive more enemy fire resulting in 2 Marine KIA and 8 WIA. An AO was called and it directed artillery and gunships with unknown results. The weather hindered the AO's vision.
- 1350H In the area of XD953590 elements of Co M made point contact with a small enemy force. Artillery was fired upon and the area swept with negative results.
- 18 Sep 1410H In the area of XD953590 elements of Co L searched area of ground attack on 170030H and found 41 NVA KIA, 60 Chicom grenades, and 124 filled AK47 magazines. The ordnance was destroyed.

1600H In the area of XD944611 elements of Co I, 3/4 searched area of 170850H contact and found 7 NVA KIA, 1 60mm mortar, 1 AK47, 193 Chicom grenades, 5 Chicom Claymores, 17 AK47 magazines, 18 helmets, 23 packs, 20 gasmasks, 1 Chicom gas grenade, and 3 RPD drums. The gear was destroyed.

1955H In the area of XD987553 elements of Co I observed 2 NVA, carrying weapons, on a road and took them under fire with unknown results.

19 Sep 0430H In the area of XD955593 elements of Co L received a heavy volume of Chicomms from an estimated platoon of NVA. At 0610H Co L received Chicomms and RPG's from the enemy that were very close to perimeter. At 0750H Co H, 2/3, pursued an enemy squad downstream and reported heavy blood trails. At 0752 Co L again received RPG's and also 60mm mortar rounds. Results were 1 USMC KIA, 8 USMC WIA, and 3 NVA KIA.

0900H In the area of XD968617 elements of Co K observed 20 NVA carrying 2 oblong objects which appeared to be recoilless rifles. Artillery was called in with unknown results.

1130H In the area of XD956598 elements of Co M found the following gear scattered around the hilltop: 1 M16 rifle, 1 satchel charge, 75 Chicomms, 5 NVA gas masks, 20 AK47 magazines, 1 NVA radio antenna, medical gear, and 10 RPG rounds with increments and fuzes.

20 Sep 0945H - 1115H In the area of XD997614 elements of Co K observed 10 rounds of 60mm mortar which landed approximately 150 meters from their perimeter. Artillery was called in on the suspected enemy position with unknown results.

21 Sep Operation Idaho Canyon terminated.
